Summary of issues (including benefits to customers/service users):

The ward performance reports provide updates on key issues and themes which link back to local priorities addressed by Neighbourhood Action Teams and the strategic themes in the Nottingham Plan 2020. The reports provide summary updates on the following key themes:

Area Committee note and comment on the Ward Performance Reports for quarter 2 2012/13.

1 BACKGROUND

- 1.1 Neighbourhood Working has been important for a number of years in Nottingham as a means of engaging better with citizens and to drive forward service improvement.
- 1.2 The Nottingham Plan has a goal that 'public service delivery will be better integrated and appropriately devolved, ensuring more accessible and responsive services for all and giving residents more control over what happens in their neighbourhoods'; the Ward Performance reports help to support this.
- 1.3 The Ward Performance Reports captures work at a local level to support the Nottingham Plan; it is a short summary of key updates on priorities and issues in the ward. More detailed implementation plans sit behind the report such as the Ward Action Plan, Neighbourhood Action Team's Action Log, Crime Drug Partnership (CDP) plans and other partner's implementation plans.
- 1.4 The Ward Performance Reports are co-ordinated by Neighbourhood Development Officers every quarter, with the data analysis undertaken by the CDP.
- 1.5 The following brief summary by the respective Ward NDO highlights the key issues:

Ward: St Ann's – NDO: Michelle Graley

Safer Theme - Crime and anti social behaviour (ASB)

Over the past quarter the overall crime reductions have levelled out after the earlier gains but overall crime reductions are at 20% year to date (Feb 2013). ASB has also witnessed a steady improvement against the baseline. However, the NAT report for March 2013 has seen a spike in Personal Robbery and Violent crime (higher DV Incidence recorded). All crime figures across the city have risen during March. St Anns has the 2nd highest rate for all ASB (per 1000 of population) of the 20 Wards (NAT group identified higher levels of Noise related ASB. Policing teams in the area are working hard in the area to reduce this initial upward trend

Neighbourhood theme – Cleansing and Environmental issues

- As part of the next 'Week of Action'- one of the things we have addressed is the short term work which has identified short term measures, which includes environmental aesthetics such as hanging baskets and window boxes. NCH are currently awaiting options for long term options to resolve the bin issues on Ransom Rd and Chandos Street (even nos).
- Dog Fouling issues across the Ward Task Group to develop and implement a plan for the next year.
- NDO and Councillors have progressed an Area Capital scheme of works across the area

Community engagement

- Family & Community Team are focussing on improving participation and engagement of young people in the area and a model of delivery for play and youth.
- Local volunteers who have undertaken level one coaching.

1.6 Ward: Dales - NDO: Greg Foister

Safer Theme - Crime and anti social behaviour (ASB)

- Over a rolling 12 months both over all crime and ASB figures report a downward trend. The Dales Ward fairs well compared with other wards in the Locality.
- There has been a very small localised increase in auto crime and ASB, identified as a small hotspot at the Locality Board in March. Resources as now being focused to address these issues.
- Recent site visits have however identified concerns that aspects of crime/ASB may rise slightly in the summer months for example noise and alcohol related ASB. The Neighbourhood Action Team will be discussing and planning how we address this.
- Recent site visits have highlighted ongoing concerns with Dog fouling, Fly Tipping and drug hotspots. The (NAT) will be discussing how to manage better these issues in the short term whilst looking for longer term solutions. Locality Management, as part of the NAT, have requested that is be provided with additional data concerning the number and type of fixed penalty notices issued to help better understand the problem we are facing.
- Currently we are continuing to clear needle hot spots, remove fly tipping within 24hrs, address issues of side waste, and investigate the use of control orders as part of a campaign around dog fouling. Officers are currently responding to issues of ASB on Colwick. In addition NCH are currently seeking planning permission to improve security and visibility from the street around Hermitage Caves.

Neighbourhood theme – Cleansing and Environmental issues

- Whilst the Dales Ward compares well generally in the area of cleanliness, with the average year to date score reaching the cleanliness bench mark. The data supports local concerns regarding the problems of Dog Fouling, fly tipping and perception of general cleanliness.
- The Neighbourhood Operations Manager and his team (Street Scene) have recently cleared a large area of fly tipping on race course road and made safe a significant drug den on the boundary of the ward. The short longer term solutions to these issues will be discussed at the NAT as noted. In addition the NAT team will be using the data and local concerns to plan a mini week of action focusing in part on the issues of dog fouling, fly tipping, noise and alcohol ASB.
- The standard of our playgrounds and parks, along with the safety on our roads remains a concern for local people and local Cllrs. A number of schemes have been funded out of Area Capital monies to improve road users and pedestrian safety. Cllrs are currently involved in the development of Parkdale and Colwick Woods Park.

Community engagement

Local Clirs have a series of Ward Walks and Local Issues meeting planned for the

coming period. The detail of this can be found in the appendix to this report. The Neighbourhood action team are seeking two joint patch walks with NCH as part of this activity.

- The local police are starting a new initiative called 'street by street' this is an opportunity for the police and community protection staff to meet local people.
- The Dales Ward is hosting a Welfare Rights event on the 26th April. This event is focussed on assisting local people understand the impact on them of the recent benefit changes and the help available.
- Family & Community Team. Greenway Centre. Sneinton Tenants and residents
 Association. SEND project and Renewal Trust Detached Youth Team have worked
 successfully with young people including the Roma Community.

Working theme - Unemployment

The Locality Management team are working with Partners to organise a Jobs, Training and Advice Fair on the 1st July 10am -3pm on Sneinton Market Square

1.7 Ward: Mapperley – NDO: Fi Cusick

Safer Theme - Crime and anti social behaviour (ASB)

- Crime in general is on a downward trend by 17%
- Autocrime is still a priority policing issue. However, known prolific perpetrator recently arrested, taken to court and given a custodial sentenced.
- Sexual crime increased incidence due to old crimes being reported now about Children's Home, Woodborough Road
- Anti-social behaviour continues to fall by 42%. Woodlane Gardens area remains a
 policing priority.
- Burglary whilst still an issue, continues to fall

Neighbourhood theme – Cleansing and Environmental issues

- The cleanliness index for the Ward has improve to 90% against the target of 86%
- Parking issues continue to be raised. Consultation regarding the installation of H-Bars on Mapperley Road and Chestnut Grove will take place soon
- NDO and Councillors continue to progress Area Capital schemes across the Ward
- A Day of Action is to take place on 11th June 2013.

South Locality Board

Funding has been accessed to establish Street Pastors in St Anns and Dales Wards to address identified street drinking in these areas they have now established this service. The board is now focusing on addressing increase in Domestic Violence in St Anns and Bridge wards learning from work piloted in Aspley. Area Chairs, or their nominated representatives are invited. Minutes will be issued to all ward councillors.
