## **REPORT OF THE ACTING DIRECTOR OF LOCAL COMMUNITIES**

#### PROPOSED NEW PROJECTS NOVEMBER 2008

### 1. <u>SUMMARY</u>

This report identifies a number of projects currently seeking funding from the Area Two Committee. If supported these projects will not only improve the lives, living environment and well being of residents in Area Two but will also ensure that Area Two funding is spent in this financial year. Appendix 1 gives comprehensive information regarding the specific projects.

#### 2. <u>RECOMMENDATIONS</u>

- 2.1 It is recommended that Bestwood and Basford Area Committee approve the allocation of funding to the projects detailed in this report.
- 2.2 Note the contribution that these projects make to the Local Area Agreement targets of:-

NI1 – percentage of people who believe people from backgrounds get on well together in their local area

NI 4 – percentage of people who feel they can influence decisions in their locality NI 5 – Overall general satisfaction in their area

### 3. BACKGROUND

Each year Area Two Committee is allocated a sum of money to be spent for the benefit of the residents of the wards of Bestwood and Basford. The projects listed on the attached appendix will improve the ward and add value to the open space and environment. They will also encourage wide community involvement in area projects and raise awareness of the work of the Area Committee

### 4. <u>PROPOSALS</u>

The attached schedule outlines requests for funding for Area Committee to consider funding or part funding.

#### 5. TIMESCALES FOR IMPLEMENTATION OF PROPOSAL

All £63,470 Allocated to Area Two Committee for 2008/09 should be allocated within the financial year and projects completed within the following year.

The expenditure outlined in this report cannot be met from the Committees' current uncommitted balance of £33,470 (Basford Ward - £23,510, Bestwood Ward - £9,960).

## 6. **FINANCIAL IMPLICATION**

The £23,885 required for the projects cannot be met from the Basford Ward current uncommitted balance of £23,510. Therefore, decisions will need to be made to prioritize projects and expenditure. This figure does not include the effect of any other requests for allocation elsewhere on this agenda.

The funds allocated by Area Committee are used to address diverse needs of various sections of the community and to reduce inequalities thereof. It also contributes towards the City Council's work in respect of the Equality Standard for Local Government.

#### 10. STRATEGIC PRIORITIES

This funding will also meet the priorities of the Respect for Nottingham Strategy as it will aid the development of cohesive communities and a strong sense of citizenship.
