REPORT OF ACTING DIRECTOR LOCAL COMMUNITIES AREA BASED GRANT

1 <u>SUMMARY</u>

The report outlines spend approved by the Local Implementation Group (LIG) for the 2008/09 financial year for the priority neighbourhood of Bestwood and Leen Valley.

2 <u>RECOMMENDATIONS</u>

IT IS RECOMMENDED that the Area Committee approve spend, as outlined in Appendix 1, under the key priorities identified within the local community plan guided by the SSCF Governance and Finance document.

3 BACKGROUND

- 3.1 One Nottingham, the Local Strategic Partnership, was awarded additional resources through the SSCF (Safer Stronger Communities Fund) for the most deprived neighbourhoods in the City. Bestwood was one of four neighbourhoods (Bulwell, Broxtowe & Bells Lane and St. Anns & Sneinton) that were identified as priority pilot areas which would benefit from the Safer, Stronger Community Fund programme during 2006/07 and 2007/08.
- 3.2 The SSCF came to a finish at the end of 2007/08 due to a change in funding streams. One Nottingham has agreed to continue to fund a range of projects in 2008/09 as a transitional year from NRF into the Area Based Grant.
- 3.3 Following a meeting with the representatives from each of the Local Implementation Groups and the Acting Director of Local Communities, the group considered an exit strategy for the project and a decision was made to allocate £30,000 to each LIG (£50,000 in the case of St Anns and Sneinton due to its size) for spend in the priority areas during 2008/09.
- 3.4 This 2008/09 funding will be overseen by the Neighbourhood Action Officer for the area and allocated in the same way as previous SSCF funding and approved by the local LIG and endorsed by Area Committees. Funds would still need to be allocated against the Priority Neighbourhood Action Plan (see appendix 1) and agreed themes contributing toward LAA targets.
- 3.5 The Bestwood Local Implementation Group agreed to allocate spend for the 2008/09 year against projects agreed at the meeting on 9th September 2008. These are detailed in appendix 1.

4 **FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS**

- 4.1 £30,000 Area-Based Grant fund has been allocated for spend on projects that will contribute towards the targets of the 2007-2010 SSCF action plan in Bestwood.
- 4.2 The SSCF governance arrangements have been produced to ensure that there are adequate financial controls on the SSCF budget. The same Governance and Financial arrangements will apply for Area-Based Grant in 2008/09.
- 4.3 The conditions of grant allocated for 2008-2009 requires that the expenditure is defrayed by 31st March 2008.
- 4.4 There are seven projects which have been approved by the LIG. The total sum of projects outlined in appendix 1 is £34,178. The difference of £4,178 will be met through the priority area support costs. This difference does not require LIG or Area Committee approval.
