- **Garage works:** where the Area Panel has indicated its support for these works, it will be necessary to ensure that firstly, the proposed financial allocations are realistic (e.g. Rosegarth Walk) and secondly, that proposals are in accordance with the latest relevant City Council strategy(ies);
- **Rosegarth Walk Garages:** the Committee appreciates that the need for such works may not always be agreed by some residents. It would be more appropriate for residents to discuss their view that City Council resources should be reallocated to resurface other pathways within the locality (e.g. at Selwyn Close) with the relevant ward councillor, rather than discuss them at the Area Committee meeting.
- Land Opposite 198 Gainsford Crescent: no work should begin at this location until its land use has been clarified. The likelihood of a positive outcome for the bid to increase sporting activity in the community is welcome but, at the same time, colleagues should avoid giving any idea that this land is a formal sports area.

15 POLICE UPDATE

Bestwood Ward

Inspector James Woolley confirmed that although levels of crime show an increase overall of 11%, levels during June – August record a consistent reduction. The increase of 30% in noise-related crime is attributed to changes in measurement and increases in reporting incidents. Incidences of burglary, anti-social behaviour, robbery and car crime have all reduced. Criminal Damage figures, although low, are higher that 2012/13. The rise in thefts is due to incidents at Co-Operative stores and to the displacement of shoplifters from the city-centre. Three known individuals have already been targeted by the Police and three warrants relating to anti-social behaviour have also been issued against tenants in the ward.

Basford Ward

Spikes in crime levels for burglary, car crime and criminal damage around the Stockhill Lane and Park Lane areas could be due to the activities of two known individuals during August

2013. Similarly, incidents at Tesco and Sainbury's stores are probably due to a small number of individuals being displaced to the area from elsewhere. Incidents of anti-social behaviour have reduced by 7% and the Police are currently reviewing trends in domestic violence incidents.

The Area Committee appreciate the efforts which are being made by the Police to control crime and improve life in the area. An area for concern, however, is the rise in incidents of domestic violence. It is important that community links are maintained and that local residents understand that the issue is important and is being addressed in an appropriate way. Inspector Woolley confirmed that research results indicate a link between alcohol and domestic violence and that an increase in levels of stress within households may also be a contributory factor. Police detection rates for Domestic violence incidents are 90%. The decision of the Co-Operative Wholesale Society to use Nottingham Police as its principal contact for crime issues and advice is welcomed.

16 WARD PERFORMANCE REPORTS: QUARTER 1 2013/14

Introducing the reports of the Director of Neighbourhood Services, Gursharan Singh Nijran and Dale Griffin provided the following updates on recent activities in their respective areas:

(a) Basford Ward – Gursharan Singh Nijran

- (i) <u>Successes</u>
 - **Crime and Anti-Social behaviour:** continues to reduce overall due to the work of Police, residents, partners and colleagues. The Old Basford Neighbourhood Watch Association has decided to close as it feels that reductions in the levels of crime and improved methods of communication (such as Alert) have led to a reduction in its role. The Neighbourhood Action Team continues to address antisocial behaviour in the priority neighbourhood area and at locations such as Whitemoor Road Allotments;
 - **Estate Cleanliness:** although the index score is slightly reduced from 2012/13, satisfaction rates amongst local residents remain good;
 - Activities for Young People: youth club night's are held at Basford and Heathfield Community Centres, four nights per week. Football training at Southwalk School two evenings per week regularly attracts attendances of up to 50 per session and the Highbury Community Based Fitness Gym gives an alternative venue to streets for local young people.

(ii) <u>Emerging Issues</u>

- **Dog Fouling and Parking:** progress is being made in association with partner organisations. Activities include covert operations regarding dog fouling;
- **Health Inequality:** the continuing challenge continues to be met by a variety of events during the Summer and two days of action with a health theme during October;

- **Lead Organisation:** concern to ensure that transition arrangements for Right Track continue smoothly to avoid disruption to citizens and services;
- **Cost Reductions:** working with colleagues, partners and residents to minimise costs, including areas which require maintenance, such as land near Selwyn Close.

(iii) Other Activity

• **Community Events:** at Highbury Vale and Vernon Park attracted attendances of over 3,000 people.

(b) <u>Bestwood Ward – Dale Griffin</u>

(i) <u>Successes</u>

- Joined up Working: continues to be a major benefit of the introduction of the Bestwood Neighbourhood Action Team in January 2013. Examples of success include work to improve the appearance of Churchfield Plantation and Leen Valley areas, increased partnership involvement by the Police, Fire Service and Community Minister in Personal, Social and Health Education (Citizenship) activities and development of a local Neighbourhood Transformation Plan;
- Young People: 150 pupils participated in the Big Wood School Day of Action. The success of the event means that a similar event will be held in March 2014 and work has already begun with Primary Schools in the area to undertake a Day of Action in June 2014. A careers event was also held at Big Wood School and the community Bestwood Cycle Centre has been launched at the William Olds Youth Centre. Ofsted Inspections: Henry Whipple and Glade Hill Primary Schools outcomes were both good;
- **Crime and Anti-Social Behaviour:** levels have stabilised, with Bestwood better than the average rate for the 20 electoral wards;
- **Cleanliness:** targets continue to be achieved and levels of fly-tipping have reduced. Levels and reasons for an increase in graffiti are being investigated

(ii) <u>Emerging Issues</u>

- **Unemployment:** remains a priority for the Neighbourhood Action Team. With Bestwood coming 4th out of the 20 electoral wards for Job Seekers Allowance claimants, city-wide initiatives will continue to be promoted under the overall supervision of the Locality Management Board;
- **Domestic Violence:** the increase in levels (mention elsewhere in minute 15) is being evaluated by colleagues and partners and the Locality Management Board. The Neighbourhood Action Team will continue to support this approach

(iii) Other Activity – Community Events

• **Southglade Park Live - 25 July 2013:** the second event attracted hundreds of local people and has been used by the Bestwood Estate Community Centre to consult local people to identify their wishes regarding activities at the local centre and to help inform the shape of the centre's Development Plan

- Leen Valley 27 July 2013: the successful event allowed engagement with local people;
- **Bestwood Park Church Fun Afternoon:** had been used by Bestwood Park Community Centre to recruit additional volunteers and listen to the views of local people;
- Love You Love the Bestwood Area: was launched on 25 July 2013. The ongoing campaign celebrates successes of local people and investment and improvements in the area and will be developed further by the Neighbourhood Action Team.
