



Summary of Analysis

- Older children (those over the age of 10) are more than twice as likely to participate in CiC reviews
- When age is cross referenced with gender analysis shows that in older children (over the age of 10), males have participated least in reviews
- Participation rates vary depending on the type of placement the child is in
- Older children are attending reviews and either representing their views themselves or being supported by an advocate or IRO. Younger children (those under the age of 10) have the higher proportion of those not attending and not contributing.



Improvements

- Head of Service oversight
- Robust performance management linked to PIMMs and team based reporting
- Change in culture
- Targeted work re disabled children
- Strengthening contracts
