Nottingham City Council – Strategic Review Programme & Community Right to Challenge

Under the Community Right to Challenge, local authorities can specify periods during which Expressions of Interest (EoIs) can be submitted for particular services. This can allow local authorities to manage the flow of EoIs and ensure that any EoIs are synchronised with existing commissioning cycles, service reviews and budgetary processes. Nottingham City Council has decided to specify periods during which EoIs can be submitted:

- 1. For services that are in Strategic Commissioning Reviews or Strategic Service Reviews, Eols can be submitted for consideration during the periods indicated in shading in the following tables.
- 2. For all other services, Expressions of Interest can be submitted for consideration during a 'default window' which will run for 3 months from the date on which the Council formally approves the budget each year (normally at the Council meeting in March).

The following reviews are part of the Strategic Commissioning Review programme. Eols can be submitted for consideration during the periods highlighted in shading.
