I write to you today to express my annoyance at what seems to be a lack of policy on the tram over "trick or treaters", and I use that term VERY lightly. Last night I was on a tram from Hucknall to Basford that departed at approximately 20:20 and, along the route, 2 young boys and a small girl boarded the tram in fancy dress. They then proceeded to accost every passenger on the train with "trick or treat!".

This is NOT what I expect on the tram, or indeed any form of public transport. They were allowed to work their way up and down the tram participating in what I believe, not to be the traditional Halloween experience, but is, in fact, the act of Begging. These children would literally harass and cajole passengers of this tram until they gave them some money. They even had the mandatory beggars' accessory, a bucket.

I fully support young people enjoying this time of year, I even admired this particular groups ingenuity by doing so on the tram, but their methods left me very annoyed and I feel it is against the spirit of this time of year for such behaviour to be allowed.

I hope you can take this constructive criticism under review and advise your staff on how to deal with such an occurrence in the future.
