HEALTH SCRUTINY IN CORE CITIES

REPORT OF HEAD OF DEMOCRATIC SERVICES

1. <u>Purpose</u>

1.1 To gain an understanding of the issues being addressed by health scrutiny panels in core cities, and the levels and methods of engagement with Health and Wellbeing Boards by the scrutiny function, to inform both this Panel's work programme and wider Council processes.

2. Action required

2.1 The Panel is asked to consider the health issues being scrutinised elsewhere within core cities at Appendix 1 to this report and to determine whether there is mileage in examining these issues in more detail here in Nottingham.

3. Background information

- 3.1 The national health and scrutiny landscape, primarily arising from the Health and Social Care Act 2012, has changed dramatically since the formation of the Coalition Government in 2010. As well as these national changes, the scrutiny function at Nottingham City Council underwent a radical restructure in the Summer of 2011, and this included the formation of this Panel, to undertake the City Council's statutory role in scrutinising health services for the City.
- 3.2 Councillors will be aware that the City and County Councils operate a Joint City and County Health Scrutiny Committee, which is the appropriate forum for consideration of significant, often high-profile cross-boundary health scrutiny issues affecting the Nottingham conurbation. This leaves responsibility 'residual' health issues arising within the City boundary resting with this Panel.
- 3.3 With the Chair's approval, it was agreed to collate current and recent examples of health scrutiny activity undertaken at other English core cities¹. This piece of work was undertaken by Ms R Mottram in Constitutional Services, and is attached at Appendix 1. In addition to identifying the issues considered at these committees, there is also feedback on how and to what extent the scrutiny function in core cities has engaged to date with Health and Wellbeing Boards.

¹ The English core cities are: Birmingham, Bristol, Leeds, Liverpool, Manchester, Newcastle, Nottingham and Sheffield.

3.4 This information provides a useful pointer both for the work of the Health Scrutiny Panel, and how it may wish to develop its relationship with the Health and Wellbeing Board. It is hoped that the information will stimulate discussion at the meeting and inform the development of the Panel's work programme.
