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#### 1 BACKGROUND

- 1.1 As a Licensing Authority for the purposes of the Licensing Act 2003 (the Act), the Council is required to carry out licensing functions under the Licensing Act 2003 and the Gambling Act 2005.
- 1.2 Licensing is a non-executive function and with certain exceptions (adoption of the Licensing Policy Statement; decisions with regard to Early morning Alcohol restriction Orders etc) the functions of the licensing authority are statutorily referred to this Committee to be discharged In turn some of these powers have subsequently been delegated to specific officers of the Council.
- 1.3 In brief, contested applications are referred to the Licensing Committee and it's Panels for consideration whilst uncontested applications and notifications are decided at officer level. This report provides an overview of the total amount of business transacted by the Authority (and the Licensing Service in general,) a large proportion of which has not been before the Committee
- 1.5 A summary of business transacted is attached at Appendix 1 for the period 1 May 2012 to 30 April 2013
