# 45 APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

#### 47 <u>MINUTES</u>

RESOLVED that the minutes of the last meeting held on 16 November 2005, copies of which had been circulated, be confirmed and signed by the Chair.

#### 48 <u>ONE NOTTINGHAM – ONE PLAN: NOTTINGHAM'S DRAFT</u> <u>COMMUNITY AND NEIGHBOURHOOD RENEWAL STRATEGY</u> (Report of Deputy Chief Executive)

Ms Wakefield presented the report to the committee and handed out the summary brochure which would be used for consultation.

Members welcomed the plan and the priorities contained in it. Requests were made for feedback on areas where the questionnaire had been returned and the priorities that the public considered to be highest.

#### RESOLVED

- (1) that the area committee consider the key priorities of the Asif working draft of One Nottingham - One Plan, in consultation with tenants' and residents' associations in the area, and feedback the results to One Nottingham by 27 January 2006;
- (2) that information on the areas with the highest return rate of the Penny questionnaire and the priorities that the public felt were most Wakefield important be reported by One Nottingham to a future meeting of this committee.

# 49 AREA PERFORMANCE REPORT

(Report of Corporate Director of Neighbourhood Services)

Members welcomed the statistics contained in the report but commented that there was a discrepancy between perception of residents and the level of anti-social behaviour incidents that had been recorded.

Members commented that housing was a high priority, especially in Bilborough where there was a high number of non-standard housing, and that this should be raised with One Nottingham and included as a priority in the plan.

It was also mentioned that the infant mortality rate in the whole of the City was twice the national average and should be raised with One Nottingham so that they could investigate the issue.
