#### **NEIGHBOURHOOD ACTION TEAM UPDATE**

# **Aspley**

- 1 Ward walks are established and going well in the Aspley Ward.
- 2 The Neighbourhood Action Teams (NATs) continue to work towards resolving priorities raised at Local Action Groups (LAGs)
- 3 Two successful projects carried out as part of the Big Spring Clean Initiative March 2009.
  - 1. 'Big Spring Clean Household Clearance', across Bells Lane, Broxtowe and Aspley beats, which saw almost 300 tonne of rubbish cleared by Streetscene along with 275 fridges, 586 TV's and 683 Tyres.
  - 2. Dog Poo pilot (24<sup>th</sup> March May 2009) This pilot is a result of dog poo consistently being a priority at the LAGs and TRA meetings, which triggered a response at NAT level. The aim of the pilot is to bring about a change in attitude, education followed by enforcement and the rewarding of the desired good dog owner behaviour and of course a reduction in the amount of dog poo in our neighbourhoods. This pilot has been part sponsored by The Aspley and Bells Lane Partnership who have also worked closely with the NAO.

The pilot consist of the following elements:

- Dog Poo Stencils sprayed on the popular routes to school footpaths.
- Dog Poo News delivered residents on the popular routes to local schools.
- The CPO's are carrying out undercover operations.
- The Dog Warden, CPO's and NAO have given assembly talks to the five local schools in the area.
- Seagrave School won the praise postcard picture competition, which thanks responsible owners that do pick up after their dogs. The praise postcard competition will be drawn beginning of May.
- The project as whole will be evaluated at the end of May 2009.
- The project has received national and local press coverage.
- 2 The Greens Car Parking Schemes: Camborne Close; Tenbury Crescent and Tilbury Rise shrubbery and seeding to planted over the six week scheme will then be complete.
- Aspley ward has nineteen closes which potentially could benefit from car parking schemes. Looking at car parking options at Allendale Avenue which potentially could be the first pilot project. The Neighbourhood Action Officer is working with Nottingham City Homes Patch Managers, the police and Highways on this project.

#### Bilborough

A Neighbourhood Action Officer (NAO) for Bilborough will be recruited by mid May 2009. In the interim period other members of the Area Management Team have ensured continuity in providing support for local communities. Members can contact the Area Manager or other Neighbourhood Action Officers with any enquiries.

## Leen Valley

- 1 The Local Action Groups (LAGs) continue to set priorities for both the Police and Nottingham City Council to work on, these presently include:
  - in the Beechdale Beat street cleansing and parking issues on Robinswood Road and Beechdale Road and the Spinney off Eskdale Drive were identified as priorities. The NAO is currently arranging a street meeting with traders, residents and Highways to try and resolve some of the issues raised;
  - in the Ainsley Beat dog fouling, burglaries in the Marchwood Close and litter were all identified as priorities. In terms of dog fouling, the Community Protection Officers have agreed to carry out an operation within the area to try and catch offenders:
  - in Hyson Green a public meeting has been arranged for the beginning of May 2009 to find out what issues are of concern to residents.
- The NAO continues to work on the redevelopment of the Robert Shaw playing field. With funding secured from the West Area Committee, work can begin on restoration of the playing fields and the entrance way, including the installation of new gates and regular maintenance of the field.
- As part of the Big Spring Clean Initiative two litter picks will take place in the Leen Valley Ward. The first one will be with pupils from Robert Shaw School and local residents on 21 April 2009. The perimeter of the school fencing will be cleaned and tidied and also the areas immediately near the school. The second litter pick will take place on the 25 April 2009 along Aspley Lane near the shops.
- The NAO continues to work with the Friends of King George V Park. The group, in partnership with Neighbourhood Management and Parks Services, are planning some consultation events around improving the children's play area. The work will include working with the specialist schools within the area to ensure that the playground is fully inclusive of all disabilities. The consultation event will include a fun day on the park to celebrate the opening of a new MUGA (multi-use games area) for young people, this event will take place in June 2009.

#### Area wide

As part of Nottingham in Bloom, a NAO has been working across the three wards to encourage community groups to get involved in the Britain in Bloom Neighbourhood Awards. A wide range of community groups and groups of neighbours have got involved with the awards and are busy planning a number of community events and hanging baskets workshops. The groups hope to create a sense of pride in their areas and improve community spirits and cohesion.
