Summary of issues:				
This report informs the Committee of the success of local groups in the Royal Horticultural				
Society's Britain in Bloom Neighbourhood Awards 2009. Councillors are asked to acknowledge				
the role played by community Bloom initiatives in improving local pride and community spirit as				
well as enhancing the environment.

# 1 BACKGROUND

- 1.1 The Britain in Bloom Neighbourhood Awards is an initiative for small, resident-led communities aiming to achieve long-term improvements to their local area through horticultural, environmental and cleanliness initiatives.
- 1.2 The Awards are non-competitive, welcoming groups taking the first step towards community regeneration. While entries are not judged against each other, they are visited in the summer by environmental and horticultural experts who provide feedback

and advice on how to develop current activities and encourage ongoing improvements. The assessors look for teamwork and community effort, floral displays, good maintenance, environmental quality (i.e. absence of litter, dog fouling, graffiti, flyposting and weeds) and overall impression.

- 1.3 Communities who participate report an increased sense of pride in the area, greater community spirit, and cleaner and greener surroundings for a healthier community. Each community receives an Award of Improvement, Merit, or Outstanding Achievement.
- 1.4 In 2009, 80 groups from Nottingham were assessed (up from just four last year). Amongst them were 21 groups from West Area, who achieved the following awards:

Albert Avenue Alive - Merit Beechdale Community Centre – Improvement Beechdale Road Shops Action Group - Improvement Bells Lane Community Centre Surprise Club and Whizzkidds - Merit **BELSATRA** - Improvement **Blooming Strelley - Merit** Bramerton Road Bungalows improvements – Improvement Cheslyn Drive - Merit Denewood TRA - Merit Friends of King George V Park - Merit Hadden Park School BTEC Group and the Friends of Strelley Recreation Ground -Merit **KAMRA** - Merit Marchwood Close – Improvement Naburn Court - Merit New Whitemoor Baptist Church - Merit New Whitemoor TRA - Merit Radford Children's Centre - Merit Sheila Russell Centre - Towle Memorial Garden - Merit St Stephen's with St Paul's Church and the Vine Community Centre - Outstanding WATRA - Improvement Woodvale, Wollaton Vale - Improvement

- 1.5 In addition, St Stephen's with St Paul's and the Vine gained the top marks across the City and was awarded the title of Best Community Project in the Nottingham in Bloom Garden Competition.
- 1.6 Two West Area projects St Stephen's with St Paul's and Blooming Strelley are amongst several featured on a ten-minute DVD created by Nottingham in Bloom in partnership with East Midlands in Bloom and the Royal Horticultural Society. This will be used regionally and nationally to inspire and encourage other communities to get involved.
