4.2 Contractors for all works will be selected via competitive tendering processes to ensure Best Value is achieved.

5 RISK MANAGEMENT ISSUES (INCLUDING LEGAL IMPLICATIONS, CRIME AND DISORDER ACT IMPLICATIONS AND EQUALITY AND DIVERSITY IMPLICATIONS)
5.1 All the proposals will meet the current requirements for Equality and Diversity, with external inspections carried out post-installation as required.
5.2 Failure to comply with the terms of the Section 106 agreements could result in requests for repayment from developers. This would reduce that level of capital funds available to finance City Council priorities.
