### 49 **GREATER NOTTINGHAM ALIGNED CORE STRATEGIES: OPTION** FOR CONSULTATION

(Interim Corporate Director of Development)

Councillors made the following comments:

- Bilborough Road was divided over two boundaries, the City Council and Broxtowe Borough Council, so sensitive cross boundary working was required;
- housing developments needed to be of mixed type and tenure to attract people to settle in the area. Room sizes needed to be adequate and the private sector housing needed to be well designed and reasonably priced and street patterns needed to be modern;
- providing new bungalows in the area would free up family housing; •
- Glaisdale Industrial site needed to be carefully developed as it was important to keep employment land in the area;
- the Core Strategies needed to include more details on proposed • future tram lines and transport links;
- employment land may have to be on the periphery of the City where there was good access to the motorway so that people could commute, but also to have fairly large employment sites for people in Nottinghamshire.

The Chair presiding at the meeting was of the opinion that this item, although not included on the agenda, should be considered as a matter of urgency in accordance with Section 100(b)(4)(b) of the Local Government Act 1972, in view of the need for the Committee to be involved in the consultation as early as possible.

### 53 <u>REDEVELOPMENT OF TRINITY SCHOOL – BUILDING SCHOOLS</u> <u>FOR THE FUTURE – URGENT ITEM</u>

Matthew Neal, Head of Building Schools for the Future (BSF) and Assets, presented the Committee with the following information:

- BSF was a major government initiative aimed at rebuilding and renewing school facilities so that every secondary school in England had 21<sup>st</sup> century facilities;
- the Wave 5 Outline Business Case approved £79 million of indicative funding;
- funding for redevelopment of Trinity School had approximately £17 million secured;
- the current phase was a feasibility study for the redevelopment which started in September 2009 and was due to be completed by the end of March 2010. This involved consultation with the school community, analysis of the existing site, site constraints and scoping of the schools education vision;
- the next phase (phase 1) was the design for the development which was started in March 2010 and was due to be completed in May 2010. This involved consultation with the wider community, developing a concept to sketch plan, re-consulting with the community and Area Committee and ensuring the design concept matched the BSF budget;
- stage 2, which included detailed design for rooms and specialist areas, was due to start in June 2010 and be completed in November 2010;

• the redevelopment was due to start in April 2011 and would be completed by January 2013.

Councillors made the following comments:

- community facilities were important as there were anti-social behaviour hotspots on some of the estates surrounding the school;
- there were tenants' and residents' associations around the school so it would be important to engage with the Beechdale Local Action Group and the Friends of King George V Park;
- the Beacon Public House football team should also be consulted and involved in developing ideas as they were in need of changing facilities;
- as Bluecoat was being developed later it would be important to point this out when consulting the community as the surrounding areas would be interested in the development of both schools.
