2.2	Area Three Panel has been consulted on the proposals for housing allocations.
2.3	Tenants and Residents Groups and Local Area groups have been asked to submit potential schemes.
2.4	At the Area Three Panel meeting held on 18 June 2010 the housing environmental schemes outlined were approved.
3	OTHER OPTIONS CONSIDERED IN MAKING RECOMMENDATIONS
3.1	A large number of schemes were submitted; however funding did not cover all proposals. The Housing environmental schemes not proposed will be carried forward for 2011-12 for consideration.
3.2	There are further schemes to consider for the Area Capital programme – further consultation will be considered and proposals will be submitted to Area Committee in September for approval.

4	FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS (INCLUDING VALUE FOR MONEY)
4.1	Nottingham City Homes has provided quotations for the proposed works. Once a city wide
	programme is agreed a competitive tendering process will take place and it is anticipated
	that savings may be found. In view of this both Aspley and Bilborough Ward schemes
	have been marginally over programmed above the budget level.
