## 1. BACKGROUND

- 1.1. In July 2010 the Aspley pilot was launched and the community assisted in developing the strategic priorities in the shaping of the ward action plan for the Aspley Ward. The three main objectives of the Aspley pilot were as follows:-
  - 1.1. Community and Frontline Officer empowerment
  - 1.2. Performance management framework
  - 1.3. Strategy to reality
- 1.2. It was agreed the Ward Action Plan would cover the following five themes Working, Family, Safer, Neighbourhood and Healthy Nottingham. Priorities and actions were set based on Statistical information and community priorities. These were then agreed by the One Nottingham Thematic Partnerships.
- 1.3. It is envisaged Ward Action Plans will be developed for all wards across the city, and depending on need, they will focus on the outlined five themes from within the Nottingham plan.
- 1.4. To assist in developing the Ward Action plans for West area the following has taken place:-
  - 1.4.1 Community consultation September 2010 December 2010
  - 1.4.2 Participative Appraisal training with residents October 2010
  - 1.4.3 Officer networking events September 2010 and February 2011
  - 1.4.4 Assessed priorities as highlighted through LAG's
  - 1.4.5 Considered data provided by relevant agencies in the area.
- 1.5. Following this work priorities have been suggested and outlined in Appendix 1. Ward Action Plans will now be developed within particular themes with the relevant Managers preparing the actions Ward Action Plan Delivery Timetable 2011/12 can be found at Appendix 2.
