ACTION

20 APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

Apologies for absence were received from Councillors Chapman, Cresswell and Watson and from Ms Bainbridge (Bells Lane and Aspley Tenants' and Residents' Association) and Mr Thorpe (Nottingham City Homes Area Panel).

21 DECLARATIONS OF INTERESTS

At the time of consideration, Councillor McCulloch declared a personal interest in agenda item 6 (minute 25), Nominations for Area Committee Community Representatives, as a member of Aspley and Bells Lane Community Centre, which did not preclude her from speaking or voting.

22 MINUTES

RESOLVED that the minutes of the last meeting held on 14 September 2011, copies of which had been circulated, be confirmed and signed by the Chair.

23 BILBOROUGH WEEK OF ACTION

The Committee received a presentation by Katie Follows of Community Action, detailing the Bilborough Week of Action events and activities which took place during the week commencing 24 October 2011.

The main points were as follows:

- the week involved lots of groups/agencies, such as the Crime and Drugs Partnership, Neighbourhood Management, Nottinghamshire Police, Community Protection, City Services, Family Community Teams, Nottingham City Homes, Bilborough and Strelley Churches and libraries, Nottingham University Samworth Academy, Bilborough College, Groundwork Greater Nottingham, Nottinghamshire Fire and Rescue Service, Last Orders/Framework, Strelley Tenants' and Residents' Association and Strelley Social Club;
- events which took place included:
 - o Monday in Beechdale and Denewood:
 - One Stop Shops at Beechdale Community Centre and Denewood Community House;
 - Spots v Stripes games on Chingford Field;
 - o an Energy Efficiency Week, where information on fuel savings and benefits was available to all citizens;
 - Tuesday in Strelley;
 - a bulky waste collection and shrub clearance at Strelley Social Club, at which 5 tonnes of waste was removed;
 - young people volunteered to litter pick, with 10 bags of rubbish removed:
 - a One Stop Shop and disco for young people at Strelley Social Club;
 - Tuesday in Bilborough;
 - Bilborough's young people discussed how to 'Make Bilborough Better', and some of their feedback included:
 - there were good schools in the area, but no places to play locally;
 - there was a need for more street lights and parks for kids;
 - there was too much noise and crime in the streets;
 - o there was too much litter outside Haddon Park School;

ACTION

- Wednesday in Balloon Woods;
 - a Community Fun Day at the Vale Community Centre, with over
 50 young people and their families attending;
 - o young people completed a litter pick around Bilborough Library;
 - a 'Respect' Football Tournament, with congratulations going to the Bilborough FC Team, having beaten Aspley Youngsters and Aspley Allstars to win the tournament;
 - Hope Nottingham was launched locally and a 'Home Hope' visit completed in a citizen's home;

Thursday – in Bilborough;

- o a One Stop Shop on Bilborough Market;
- a Tea Dance held at St John's Church Hall, with a very big thank you to Strelley Tenants and Residents Association for organising this event;
- the West 8 Partnership Holiday Club completed a litter pick at Glenbrook School, collecting 13 bags of rubbish;
- Friday at the Nottingham University Samworth Academy (NUSA);
 - o an intergenerational community tea party, which approximately 70-80 citizens attended. 10 NUSA student volunteers helped at the event on the day, 300 cakes were donated by Sir David Samworth, of which 50 were donated to a local church, and support from Groundwork Greater Nottingham was also provided on the day for younger children;

outcomes from the week were;

- approximately 250 citizens engaged with officers at One Stop Shops,
 150 children and young people took part in activities and over 100 people attended activities at Bilborough and Strelley libraries;
- people involved in Community Payback had painted railings outside Portland School;
- citizens voted on posters designed by Melbury School, aimed at preventing dog fouling, with the winning entry being displayed around the area;
- home fire safety checks completed for vulnerable citizens;
- o 427 households had been informed about energy efficiency benefits;
- approximately 25% of the citizens attending One Stop Shops were not previously known to officers;
- an anti-social behaviour hot spot was tackled by removing shrubbery next to Strelley Social Club;
- the Week of Action brought together all the youth service providers in the area, the outcome of which was that they had now formed a youth forum to work together on youth issues in the ward, including use of the feedback from 'Making Bilborough Better' to inform the planning of youth provision;
- Strelley Social Club was to host another disco for young people at Christmas:

a drop-in session at Birchover Park Community Centre provided an opportunity for the Management Committee, Play and Youth staff and Safer Neighbourhoods Teams to work together, with positive feedback from young people leading to the event being replicated during the February 2012 half term.

RESOLVED that the thanks of the Committee to Ms Follows for the presentation be recorded.

24 NEIGHBOURHOOD BLOOM

(Director for Sport, Culture and Parks)

The report was presented by Julie Walker, Nottingham in Bloom Partnership Manager, and detailed the budget for and locations of floral displays in West Area for 2012-13 and informed the Committee of the outcome of a Royal Horticultural Society: Britain in Bloom – It's Your Neighbourhood Award report.

During discussion, Councillors stated that, where possible, the budget for Nottingham Bloom should be protected as the scheme was good for the community and brought local people together.
