1 APPOINTMENT OF CHAIR AND VICE-CHAIR

RESOLVED to appoint Councillor Carole McCulloch as Chair and Councillor Wendy Smith as Vice-Chair for the municipal year 2013/14.

4 MINUTES

The Committee confirmed the minutes of the meeting held on 20 February 2013 as a correct record and they were signed by the Chair.

5 STREAMLINING INVESTMENT TO THE VOLUNTARY SECTOR (SIVS): AREA BASED GRANT MONITORING

Further to minute 40 dated 20 February 2013, the Committee considered a report of the Joint Director of Quality and Commissioning / Head of Early Intervention and Market Development, summarising the progress on Phase One of SIVS and outlining the grant award and monitoring processes. Louise Graham also gave a short presentation highlighting the key areas of the monitoring process.

In response to a question from the Committee, Louise Graham stated that West Area has been allocated £169,077.75 for the remaining 9 months of this financial year, with the lead organisation (Groundwork Greater Nottingham) responsible for how the funding is allocated.

RESOLVED to

- (1) note the proposed area based grants monitoring process, including the routes for discussion and challenge;
- (2) approve submission by the lead organisation of a 6-monthly report to Committee.

6 HARVEY HADDEN LEISURE CENTRE REDEVLOPMENT / SPORT ENGLAND ICONIC BID - UPDATE

Further to minute 21 dated 5 December 2012, the Committee received a presentation by John Wileman, Sport and Leisure, and Clive Williams, Leisure Transformation Programme, updating it on progress regarding the redevelopment of Harvey Hadden Leisure Centre.

During discussion, the following comments were made:

- (a) a full traffic assessment is ongoing to ensure there is sufficient parking available when completed, and a system of charging is to be introduced shortly in the Wigman Road area;
- (b) the redevelopment will be part of the Local Employment Partnership (LEP) so, where possible, local people will be employed;
- (c) the completion date is currently spring 2015, and Beechdale Baths will stay open until the Harvey Hadden works are completed;
- (d) as the proposal includes a split pool with a rising floor, the local community can use the facilities during the day, alongside the provision for school use;
- it is proposed that once open, the facilities will be cost-neutral as the income from users will be re-invested into the running costs etc;
- (f) there is the possibility for a corporate sponsor of uniforms, although no-one has been approached yet as it is too early in the process.

RESOLVED to note the latest position.

7 SAFER AND NEIGHBOURHOOD NOTTINGHAM PLAN THEMES AND ANTI-SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR – UPDATE

In relation to West Area, the Committee received updates, including performance against targets and actions undertaken, on the Safer Nottingham and Neighbourhood Nottingham themes of the Nottingham Plan and anti-social behaviour.

The following was reported:

(a) Inspector Fenwick – Safer Nottingham

- (i) there are additional staff starting in the local area on 1 July 2013;
- (ii) crime is slightly up in the area, due to a spate of burglaries, although the overall reduction target of 10% is still on course;
- (iii) there have been 'ward walks', which have identified hot spots and action has been prioritised as a result.

(b) Shaun Roome – Neighbourhood Nottingham

- (i) during the last 12 months, the Broxtowe Community Protection Officer (CPO)

 Team have carried out 126 dog fouling operations and issued 25 £50 fins for dog fouling, 7 of which were in the Aspley ward;
- (ii) CPOs are now encouraged to knock on doors in the local area to try to gain information on offenders if they find an incident of dog fouling;
- (iii) the new 2013/14 key performance indicator for CPOs is to carry out 750 dog fouling operations in the 12 months (108 per CPO Team);
- (iv) crime and anti-social behaviour has decreased significantly over the last 5 years and West Area estates are now 3* rated.

(c) Richard Antcliff – Anti-social behaviour

- (i) under the government's previous 'Respect' strategy, the City's 'Well Nottingham' theme was acknowledged as best practice and rolled-out nationally;
- (ii) Nottingham recognises the 'broken window' theory (Keizer, Lindenberg, Steg) which states that low-level issues, such as noise, litter, graffiti, untidy gardens and fly-tipping, contributed to levels of crime, sometimes as much as doubling incidents;
- (iii) poorly managed public space also contributes to higher levels of crime, and has the effect of lowering levels of confidence in security and reduces the feeling of safety in the community;
- (iv) the City's Neighbourhood Policing Team (covering 61 beats) has 100 CPOs, who have powers from the Chief Constable and the Leader of the City Council, and a key performance indicator for them is to be on patrol (on foot) for 85% of their work time.

RESOLVED to note the latest position in West Area regarding the Safer and Neighbourhood Nottingham themes and anti-social behaviour.

8 AREA CAPITAL FUND 2013-15 AND ENVIRONMENTAL SCHEMES

Further to minutes 37 and 39 dated 20 February 2013, the Committee considered a report of the Director of Neighbourhood Services, which updated Councillors and local representatives on 'in progress', completed and proposed highways and footpath schemes already approved in West Area wards.

9 WARD PERFORMANCE – QUARTER 4 2012/13

Further to minute 36 dated 20 February 2013, the Committee considered a summary report, covering all 3 wards, and more detailed individual ward reports, presented by the relevant Neighbourhood Development Officer (as recorded in the brackets below). The main points were as follows:

(a) Aspley (Sioban Campbell)

- (i) **Crime:** down 15.06%;
- (ii) **ASB:** down 29.46%;
- (iii) Graffiti Reports: 6 incidents (increase of 2);
- (iv) **Fly Tipping:** 12 incidents (increase of 6);
- (v) **Unemployment Rate:** decrease of 1.7%;
- (vi) **Community Protection:** November 2012 = 2 court outcomes;
- (vii) **Fire:** Deliberate fires = 5 (increase of 4 on February 2012).

(b) Bilborough (Julianne Christou)

- (i) **Crime:** down 1.75%;
- (ii) **ASB:** down 52.69%;
- (iii) Graffiti Reports: 3 incidents (no change);
- (iv) Fly Tipping: 7 incidents (no change);
- (v) **Unemployment Rate:** decrease of 5.6%;
- (vi) Community Protection: no court cases;
- (vii) Fire: Deliberate fires = 18 (decrease of 31.03% on February 2012).

(c) Leen Valley (Deborah Wilson)

- (i) **Crime:** up 27.40%;
- (ii) **ASB:** down 31.50% (54 fewer calls);
- (iii) **Graffiti Reports:** 7 incidents (increase of 4);
- (iv) Fly Tipping: 3 incidents (decrease of 2);
- (v) **Unemployment Rate:** increase of 8.3%;
- (vi) Community Protection: no court cases;
- (vii) **Fire:** Deliberate fires = 12 (decrease of 33% on February 2012).

RESOLVED to note the ward performance for quarter 4 2012/13.
