17 WARD PERFORMANCE – QUARTER 2 2013/14

Further to minute 9 dated 22 May 2013, the Committee considered a summary report, covering all 3 wards, and more detailed individual ward reports, presented by Julianne Christou, Neighbourhood Development Officer. The main points were as follows:

(a) Aspley

- (i) **Crime:** down 18.4%;
- (ii) **ASB:** no change;
- (iii) Graffiti Reports: 41 incidents (increase of 33 on July 2012);
- (iv) **Fly Tipping:** 43 incidents (increase of 26);
- (v) **Unemployment Rate:** decrease of 4.6% on the previous month;
- (vi) **Fire:** Deliberate fires = 4 (decrease of 50% on July 2012).

(b) Bilborough

- (i) **Crime:** down 2.65%;
- (ii) **ASB:** up 53.03%;
- (iii) Graffiti Reports: 24 incidents (increase of 15 on July 2012);
- (iv) **Fly Tipping:** 23 incidents (increase of 9);
- (v) **Unemployment Rate:** decrease of 4.1% on the previous month;
- (vi) **Fire:** Deliberate fires = 15 (decrease of 75% on July 2012).

(c) Leen Valley

- (i) **Crime:** up 27.40%;
- (ii) **ASB:** up 5.17%;
- (iii) Graffiti Reports: 3 incidents (no change on July 2012);
- (iv) Fly Tipping: 11 incidents (increase of 7);
- (v) **Unemployment Rate:** decrease of 5.4% on the previous month;
- (vi) Fire: Deliberate fires = 1 (decrease of 9% on July 2012).

RESOLVED to note the ward performance for quarter 2 2013/14 and request the Neighbourhood Development Officer to contact Mr Clough to further discuss the Leen Valley Health Theme Ward priority.

Mark Parrott, Lead Coach for Notts County Football in the Community, and Lisa Grocock, a local resident, attended the meeting and informed the Committee of the work being undertaken in the local area. The main points were:

- sessions at local leisure centres, costing 50p-£1.00 per day, involve a number of different sports activities and are attended by over 50 children every day, with the money received used to provide refreshments so the activities are non-profit making;
- other activities in the local area, such as a 'bike doctor', swimming and learning how to make short films, have involved working with over 70 children each day;
- other partners involved include the City Council and City Homes;
- the Notts County Community Football scheme is officially one of the best in the country and is used as an example for other authorities.
