Summary of issues (including benefits to customers/service users):		
<p>The Spectacolour budget is proposed to be reduced this year due to financial pressures. While there will be no funding for green space improvements to the area as in previous years, core floral displays for the area will still be provided. Area Committee is asked to note the floral displays for 2011.</p> <p>The Committee is also asked to encourage local groups to participate in the Britain in Bloom 'It's Your Neighbourhood' awards.</p>

2	That the Committee encourages and commits support for local neighbourhoods taking part in the Britain in Bloom 'It's Your Neighbourhood' awards.	

1 BACKGROUND

- 1.1 Nottingham in Bloom is a corporate initiative linking local communities, businesses and individuals through sustainable partnerships, working together to produce horticultural excellence and enhance the local landscape, the environment and character of Nottingham.
- 1.2 Proposals for 2011 fall into two categories – Neighbourhood Bloom displays and local participation in the Britain in Bloom awards.

1.3 Neighbourhood Bloom Displays

In previous years the available budget for floral displays in the neighbourhoods was £10,000 per Area. Due to financial pressures it is proposed to reduce this to £5,000 per Area for 2011-12. This will still provide 40 barrier baskets and 10 floor planters per Area but will reduce resources available to make improvements to areas of communal land and green space improvements.

1.4 Britain in Bloom 'It's Your Neighbourhood' Awards

Nottingham has a proud record in the national and regional Bloom competitions. In 2009 and 2010 the campaign focused solely on the city's neighbourhoods. This proved highly successful, with 137 groups from Nottingham participating in the 'It's Your Neighbourhood' awards in 2010, representing the involvement of 6,000 people. This included eight groups from Area 7. Following the success of last year's campaign it is planned to encourage more groups to participate this year.
