4 <u>PUTTING CITIZENS AT THE HEART - NOTTINGHAM CITY COUNCIL NEW</u> <u>OPERATING MODEL - PHASE 2 (CHILDREN'S ELEMENTS)</u>

Alison Michalska, Corporate Director Children and Adults, presented her report providing feedback following the end of the consultation period on Phase 2 of a proposed new operating model that will provide for a way of working and structure that supports the focus on citizens and customers at the heart of the operation of the Council. Consultation began on 3 March 2014 and was scheduled to conclude on 16 April 2014. The timing of the Children's Safeguarding inspection on 11 March to 2 April led senior management to decide to extend the collective consultation period on the proposed changes to allow for serious consideration to be given to the impact of any findings and recommendations on the proposed new roles and operating model. Consultation was extended until 16 May 2014. On 22 April this Committee approved a further extension to the collective consultation period for the Children's element until 30 June 2014 to allow for full and proper consideration of the recommendations and findings of the Ofsted Report which was published on 14 May 2014 and to assess the impact on the drivers and rationale for change.

RESOLVED to approve the recommendation contained in the report.
