### Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

#### S. 19 Licensing Act 2003

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made under this licence
  - a. At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of it or,
  - b. At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- 2. Every retail sale or supply of alcohol made under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 3. (1) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
  - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant—risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children—
    - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to
      - drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
      - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise)
    - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act)
    - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;
    - (d) provision of free discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on
      - (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
    - (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
       (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
- 4. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- 5. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
  - (2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.

- 7. The responsible person shall ensure that -
  - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures-
    - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
    - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
    - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
  - (b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

### S20 Licensing Act 2003

The admission of children under the age of 18 to film exhibitions permitted under the terms of this licence shall be restricted in accordance with any recommendations made

- By the British Board of Film Classification (BBFC,) where the film has been classified by that Board, or
- b. By the Licensing Authority where no classification certificate has been granted by the BBFC, or, where the licensing authority has notified the license holder that section 20 (3) (b) of the Licensing Act 2003 applies to the film.

# Annex 3 - Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority (3 November 2005)

- Electrical sockets used by entertainers shall be fitted with residual current device protection (complying with BS 7671 Requirements for Electrical Installations) and labelled accordingly.
- 2. The dance floor shall be clearly delineated and shall be positioned in such a way as to ensure the safety of persons using the dance floor.
- The arrangements for access around the dance floor and for seating in the vicinity of the dance floor shall be such that neither dancers, nor others, seated or otherwise, are put at risk of injury.
- 4. No adult entertainment will be provided.
- 5. A proof of age policy will operate in relation to relevant licensable activities.
- 6. A zero tolerance towards illegal drugs will operate at all times.
- A CCTV system must be installed and maintained to the satisfaction of the Police.
   All video tapes must be retained for a minimum period of 31 days and made
   available for inspection by the Police or an authorised Officer of Nottingham City
   Council.
- 8. Door staff registered with the SIA will be employed at appropriate times during the hours when licensable activities provided.
- 9. Arrangements will be made for the storage and disposal of waste which do not cause a nuisance including the internal storage of receptacles for bottles.
- 10. Any noise from the licensable activities will be monitored in order to prevent nuisance and steps will be taken to prevent its recurrence.
- 11. Waste bins and receptacles shall be removed from the street within a reasonable time from their being emptied.
