1. <u>REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATIONS</u>

- 1.1 As the major tram construction works draw towards completion and testing of the trams on the new sections of track commences, attention is now being given to the preparations for the introduction of public services from summer 2015.
- 1.2 As a result of delays in the construction process the start date for the commencement of tram public operations has had to be put back. Although a precise start date is still to be confirmed it is important that residents, retailers and other commerce are ready for the changes the introduction of the tram will bring.

- 1.3 The introduction of the new NET tram services will result in significant changes to the way people in the Meadows, Wilford, Ruddington Lane and the Clifton Estate will be able to move about.
- 1.4 The introduction of the tram has had a significant impact on neighbourhoods and is helping to draw in investment.
- 1.5 Securing the input of members of the Area Committee at an early stage will help ensure that effective engagement with local people is achieved.

2. BACKGROUND (INCLUDING OUTCOMES OF CONSULTATION)

2.1 The following outlines programmes of activities being considered for the different stages in the run up to the commencement of tram public running:

Tram testing phase

- Thank residents and businesses for their patience during the disruptive construction phase.
- Raise awareness of safety issues associated with on street tram running for pedestrians, cyclists, motorists, children and disabled people.
- Identify opportunities to improve tram stop access routes.

Run up to public services commencing

- Signpost tram timetable, fares and ticketing option information.
- Inform local people of any changes to local bus services.
- Stress what is being done to promote interchange including smart ticketing, interchange information, real time applications, printed information and Linkbus connections.
- Expertise available to support local travel planning.

Launch of public services

- Official opening ceremony.
- Comprehensive launch activity programme.

Once public services are established

- Free tram travel for up to three months for residents most affected by the tram construction works.
- Promote district centre as local attraction.
- Promote the wide range of destinations now accessible via the tram network.
- Input into monitoring and evaluation programme.
- 2.2 Input from members of the Committee in the development of the programme to a more detailed level will be welcome.
