1. <u>Purpose</u>

1.1 The Committee will view two short DVDs produced by Nottingham Clinical Commissioning Group. The DVDs are a useful tool to explain and expose issues within the health and adult social care system and illustrate how the integrated care programme model is working to improve the experience of the citizens in Nottingham.

2. <u>Action required</u>

2.1 The Committee is asked to view the two animated DVDs entitled 'Ada's Story' to increase members understanding of how the integrated care programme operates within the city. Members will also have the opportunity to discuss issues raised within the DVDs.

3. <u>Background information</u>

- 3.1 The short animated DVDs have been produced for staff and stakeholders and outline some of the issues that the integrated care programme model is aiming to address.
- 3.2 Ada represents the familiar citizen and carer experience within the local health and social care system, both now and in the future. At her most vulnerable Ada receives the care and treatment she requires but she is passed between different services, seen by different teams and quickly loses her independence and confidence.
- 3.3 The aim of an integrated care programme model is to ensure services are delivered collaboratively, linking health and social care provision to provide people like Ada with a better experience.
