- Consultation and informing

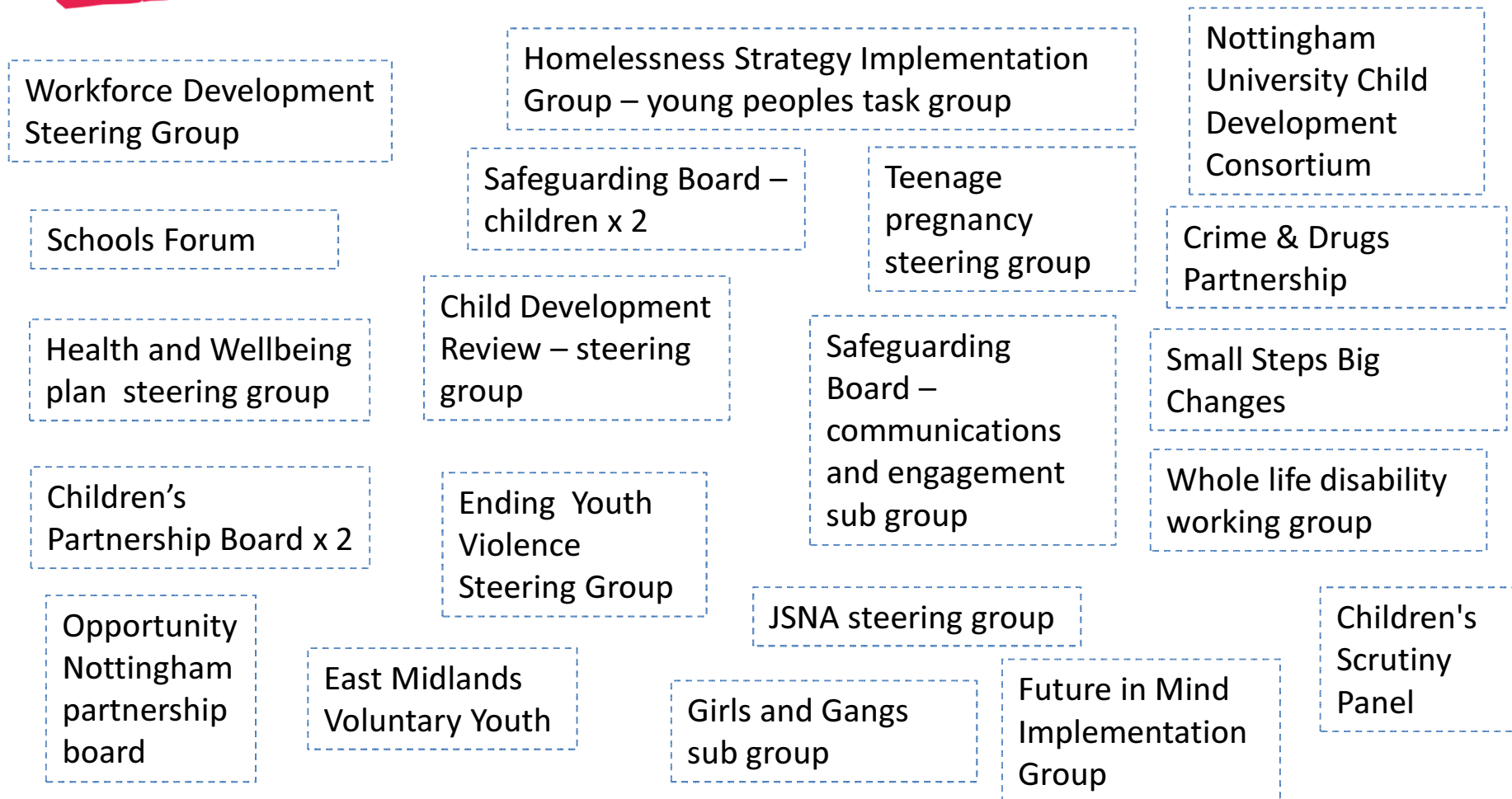
The networks have inputted into a number of strategies affecting children and families in the city, including:
