U n i v e r s a l C r e d i t



Universal Credit (UC) replaces the six main means tested benefits and tax credit for people of working age.

- Income Support
- Income Based JSA
- Income Related Employment and Support Allowance
- Housing Benefit
- Child Tax Credit
- Working tax credit



U n i v e r s a l C r e d i t



- Began in Nottingham in February 2016
- Currently only for single, fit for work, non-homeowners in Nottingham City
- Roll out of the full digital service will be in June 2018
- Currently we have 341 live cases
- 80% of tenants on UC are in arrears,
- £648 average arrears, double that of tenants not on UC
- Job Centre Plus outreach



Benefit Cap



- Currently 232 tenants affected
- As of Autumn 2016, Benefit Cap limits – per week:

Situation	Current	New
• Single	£350	£257.69
• Lone parent	£500	£384.62
• Couple	£500	£384.62
• Couple with children	£500	£384.62



Under 22s



- No automatic help with housing costs in Universal Credit from April 2017. However this only affects claimants on full digital service.
- Exclusions:
 - Parents
 - Vulnerable groups –those with health issues and careleaver
 - Young people unable to live with parents
 - Working young people
 - Those who have been in work for 6 months plus – for the first 6 months after leaving work
- Unable to claim DHP
