	Capital Programme & major works	There have been some hot water problems at Palmer Court which were linked to the gas shut off systems at the schemes. Engineers have been on site and are working to get the problems rectified. All residents were kept up to date with progression of this work which was completed on 3 July 2017 when a panel and sensor were changed. A meeting has been arranged for 13 September for NCH officers to meet with Palmer Court residents and local councillors to provide an update on the heating and water situation.

## **Arboretum**

The final phase of the major fencing scheme to Birkin Avenue has now commenced on site and will be complete before the end of Summer. This will have resulted in the majority of properties to this estate benefitting from the fencing works and overall seeing an improvement in the physical appearance of this estate.

#### **Dunkirk & Lenton**

We have received the relevant funding at the area committee to carry out major boundary improvements to 2-16 Coleby Avenue, by installing bespoke metal railings and carrying out reinstatement work to the footpaths. The outcome will be a huge improvement in the appearance of this complex and help improve safety and security for tenants as the area will be more open by removal of the poor quality/overgrown hedges. This project has now commenced on site and will be complete in September with a positive reaction from the residents to date.

Church Square Scheme now has Executive Board Approval to construct 17 new family homes. The site has now transferred into NCH's ownership and NCH will also own and manage the new homes after construction. On target for 23/03/18 completion

**Street or Block Champions** – This is a new initiative for our tenants and leaseholders to be an important voice in their area, providing a valuable link between us and their neighbourhoods. To launch this new initiative we hosted a launch event at the Council House recently where we invited our tenants and leaseholders who expressed an interest to be involved. Over 40 of our tenants attended the event and we are hoping to recruit many more.

**NCH annual Fun Day** - We've held our Fun Day for a number of years - it's the biggest event we organise for our residents with more than 600 people attending last year.

There's going to be lots happening on the day to keep the whole family entertained. From have-a-go activities, demonstrations, entertainment, workshops, arts and crafts and food and refreshments. We've even got some of the animals from White Post Farm coming along.

Our Fun Day will take place at Bulwell Academy on Saturday 16 September from 12 noon until 4pm.

**Best Garden Competition** - The annual best garden competition has been held in Nottingham for more than 80 years. It recognises the genuine pride taken by our tenants and leaseholders in looking after their gardens. Our Ace Inspectors have recently been judging this year's competition. The winners will be invited to an awards ceremony at the council house in November.

#### **Gas Leak at Woodlands**

# **Fire Safety at Woodlands**

The local team have been working very hard over the past month in conjunction with our estate services team to enforce our sterile corridor policy at the Woodlands. We will shortly be moving onto working on our low rise properties which includes Canning Circus and Argyle Court.

# **Housing Management Trainees**

NCH have been supporting the progression of apprentice Housing Management Trainees over the past year. Two of these Trainees have been based at Radford DHO and supported by the team and they have both now secured full-time employment in their chosen profession.
