	Capital Programme & major works	Pine View/Willow View - Works have now started on the second lifts and are progressing well.	
		Sprinklers at Pine View have been installed in most of the flats, Oak is progressing well with installations starting in Elm and Ash. Willow will be the final Woodlands block to receive sprinklers. There are some access issues but we are working through the no access process with the housing team.	
		Cadent are a gas network provider, they sent a letter to residents at the Woodlands saying urgent work was required. This worried some residents. NCH met with Cadent to clarify the work - survey to determine level of work, design of work to pipes will have NCH final decision on it. Once surveys
