## Fees and Charges

## Overview/Executive Summary

263 responses were received within the consultation period and so are included in the data.
Key data:

- $38 \%$ strongly agreed, and a further $43 \%$ agreed that the system should be fair to everyone. A total of $81 \%$ positive.
- There was a more even spread in responses regarding the gradual introduction, with $45.6 \%$ positive responses and $37.3 \%$ negative responses. A further 17.1\% either didn't know or didn't respond.
- $48.7 \%$ of respondents were not in favour of increasing fees, however within that a very close result of $26.9 \%$ and $23.6 \%$, respectively, each agreed and disagreed.
- The majority did not request a further financial assessment.
- There were a range of responses in the qualitative sections
- A number of respondents made mention of both income in other areas, and of instances in which they felt other citizens were treated more favourably.
- Of those that provided demographic data most were female, White British and indicated having a long term health condition or disability which is representative of those surveyed.

There were a wide range of responses to this question, however, 90 respondents ( $34.2 \%$ ) chose to not answer this question.

Broadly responses fell into a number of themes; open to contributing more, happy with the concept but concerned for their own situation, unhappy with the concept of contributing at all, and unhappy with other recent changes.

Question 5: Would you like to speak to someone from the Fairer Charging Team about having a new financial assessment because you feel your circumstances have changed or because you previously declined an assessment?

Only $11 \%$ of respondents requested a financial assessment, these have been duly processed.

Question 6: Please use this space if there is anything else you'd like to tell us about these proposed changes?

Over sixty percent (64.6\%) of respondents did not complete this section.

## Demographics

Of all respondents $85 \%$ provided their gender, $90 \%$ their age, and $70 \%$ as to whether they had a long term health condition or disability. $87 \%$ provided their ethnic identification, with two respondents writing an explanation as to why they would not answer this question.
