		Kitchen and bathrooms 357 properties have received new kitchens, bathrooms, requires and loft insulation. Current programme is due to end at the end of January. Next year CRaM will be given 200 kitchens and 200 bathrooms to complete - contractor to complete the balance of improvement works.
