1 That the Committee supports the Meadows community's entry into Britain in Bloom 2013 and considers giving a financial contribution of £2,290 from Bridge Ward towards enhanced floral displays.

1. BACKGROUND

1.1 Britain in Bloom is run by the Royal Horticultural Society (RHS) and is one of Europe's largest horticultural campaigns. The aim is to improve the environment, with marks awarded for Horticultural Achievement, Environmental Responsibility and Community Participation.

Entry into Britain in Bloom 2013

- 1.2 Over the past ten years or so, The Meadows has earned a national reputation for its Bloom activities so much so that the area was showcased by the RHS for the launch of the Britain in Bloom Impact Report in November 2011.
- 1.3 In 2012 The Meadows competed in the Urban Community category of East Midlands in Bloom, the regional arm of Britain in Bloom, and gained a creditable Silver Gilt Award and the regional trophy. As a result, the area has been invited to represent the East Midlands in Britain in Bloom 2013. Two judges will visit during the first or second week of July 2013.
- 1.4 A committee of individuals and group representatives from The Meadows has been meeting regularly to discuss the entry and to ensure the involvement of as many local people and initiatives as possible. City Council officers are giving support and advice, and business sponsorship has also been secured.
- 1.5 Last year the Area Committee made a financial contribution towards additional floral displays at the Bridgeway Centre. The Meadows in Bloom Committee would like these displays to be repeated this year and has also requested provision of two additional hanging baskets. The Area Committee is asked to consider a contribution of £2,290 from Bridge Ward to enable these enhancements to go ahead. In addition, the Meadows in Bloom Committee hope to work with local young people to suggest further ways of brightening up the shopping area.
