

<u>EPIC Partnership</u> Cliff Road Project

17^{tt} September -23rd October 2012



Context

- The sessions were a partnership project ran with local PCSO's, and residents group who identified the need to run structured supervised football/sport sessions on the Cliff Road Park
- Consultation by PCSO Zoe Wade took place, involving local residents and young people and EPIC were contacted to offer advice on the best fit scheme
- Lack of local provision for approx 20-40 young people created the potential for anti social behaviour in the area
- No structured activity was available for this community and children rarely socialised with each other



Overview

- A 6 week pilot project took place, funded by Councillors.
- The project has engaged 21 young people, 60% of which were female. Out of 21, 3 attend Nottingham Academy; 4 attend William Booth; 1 attends Sycamore Academy; 1 attends Huntingdon Academy; the remainder attend schools out of the area.
- During the 6 weeks there was a high degree of parental involvement, most of which indicated that they would be interested in staying on as volunteers.
- A presentation/evaluation evening took place at Nottingham Contemporary, where all those that took part received medals, and special prizes were presented to those who demonstrated the most commitment and team work.
- All those that took part were given free tickets for them and their family, to attend Notts County v Brentford, thanks to the Notts County FITC team.



Summary

- We need to secure funding to continue to run the session, and increase participation by involving the wider community.
- Change the session time to Sunday mornings, run the session like a training session, with a view to forming a girl's team (or mixed team for under 12's), and signpost the boys towards local clubs like St Anns and Sneinton FC www.sasfc.com
- Organise competitive friendly football matches with local schools/clubs.
- Make families aware of provision in nearby St Anns and Sneinton, particularly holiday programmes like The Community Games.
- Run or signpost parents to UK Sports Leaders/FA Level 1 award to give parents the skills to become involved in the delivery of sessions.
- Continue to seek support from local partners and groups.
