Future Allocations

£81,705 of Section 106 funding is currently available and unallocated in Area 1 and should be spent by September 2013.

It is proposed that £35,000 of this funding allocated for further works at Bulwell Forest recreation ground. This project is currently out to tender and until designs and prices are received, it is not known whether the £179,000 budget in place will be sufficient to deliver all elements of the play area, gym, MUGA and Parkour areas that are desired.

Proposed £42,105 to fund a toddlers play area within the grounds of the new right track premises. Budget to fund capital works for installation of play area and for 5 - 10 years for the facilities maintenance.

The GreenPlaces Fund

The GreenPlaces Fund is a new initiative run by charity GreenSpace and being implemented in Nottingham as a pilot authority.

The Fund has a vision to develop a national mechanism for green space giving that can support parks and green spaces. It aims to attract donations, funding and commitment from both businesses and individuals that will:

- Entitle everyone in the UK to have easy, safe and close access to quality parks and green spaces where they live.
- Encourage collaboration between businesses, local authorities and communities to work in partnership to improve and sustain their local parks and green spaces.
- Inspire communities to recognise the value of green space and boost usage to improve their health and quality of life.

The GreenPlaces Fund seeks to create a new town or citywide partnership between communities, local authorities, business and NGOs aimed at improving and sustaining parks and green space.

The fund will select projects to support in Nottingham, including park and open space improvements, community activities and biodiversity projects.
