An update on this will be available for the Group in December.</li> <li>It is suggested that investment in early intervention be discussed at Schools Forum should there be an opportunity for schools to participate in EI programmes such as PATHS (Promoting Alternative Thinking Pathways) in the future. IC informed the group that Professor Michael Little had provided a presentation to the Head Teacher Conference recently which included information on the PATHS programme.</li> <li>SS informed the Group that the Family Nurse Partnership have recruited staff in preparation for delivery to a higher proportion of their eligible cohort in the City, with a £75,000 government grant for set-up.</li> </ul>  |

| 5 | <ul> <li>Strategic Commissioning Intentions</li> <li>CW presented the paper to the Group outlining the Council's approach to supporting voluntary sector organisations and reducing spend on services, which are necessary due to the recent reductions in budgets and grants.</li> <li>Five key reviews have been identified and are being undertaken within a six-week period, with completion by the end of October. By this time there will be a process scoped to remove resources from mainstream services and to invest in early intervention approaches.</li> <li>It is important to make the process for the Voluntary and Community Sector much more transparent and streamlined. The Council is offering support to enable contribution to the SCIs, around identifying costs, developing business plans and training. There has been a positive response.</li> <li>The Council are developing a website for providers to stay informed and contribute. The web address will be sent to SOG members once live.</li> <li>It was noted that there is political support for this approach. Cllr Collins asked for the VCS review and politicians understand that we need the SCIs in order to future-proof for increasing levels of need.</li> </ul> |
