7 OFFICIAL COMMUNICATIONS

The Chief Executive reported the following communications:-

Honorary Alderman Grace Roberts

Honorary Alderman Grace Roberts served as a member of this Council following a by-election on 26 June 1969 until her retirement from office on 5 May 1983. She was made an Honorary Alderman in June 1983 in recognition of her service to the Council.

From June 1969 to May 1976 she represented Trent ward and from May 1976 until her retirement, Greenwood ward. Both Trent and Greenwood wards formed part of the current Dales ward.

As a City Councillor, Grace Roberts was a member of the Housing, Environment and Health and Baths and Parks Committees and Leader of the City Council's Conservative Group.

Arguably her greatest achievement was her appointment as the first female Sheriff of Nottingham in 1976. As Sheriff, she became actively involved in charity work with Sneinton Care Group, the Marriage Guidance Council, Citizens Advice Bureau and as a school governor and manager, in addition to participating in a civic exchange visit to Minsk.

Grace Roberts was aged 99.

Alan Sillitoe

The author, poet and dramatist, Alan Sillitoe died on 25 April 2010 at the age of 82.

Alan Sillitoe was born on 4 March in Nottingham in 1928 and worked at the Raleigh bicycle factory from 1942 before becoming an air traffic control assistant (1945-6) and then a RAF wireless operator in Malaya from 1946 to 1949.

A bout of tuberculosis following demobilisation proved a catalyst and he began to write, and then to travel through France and Spain with his future wife, the poet Ruth Fainlight, whom he married in 1959.

Initially a poet and later a novelist and dramatist, Alan Sillitoe's output was firmly rooted in and reflected his experiences of working class life in and around Nottingham, and the quality of his award-winning 'Saturday Night and Sunday Morning' and 'The Loneliness of the Long Distance Runner' provided career making roles for both Albert Finney and Tom Courtenay and remain in the public's mind to this day.

These early works were consolidated by a further series of novels and collections of poetry over the next four decades and resulted in further academic appointments and awards, including Visiting Professor of English at Leicester De Montfort University between 1994 and 1997, Fellowship of the Royal Geographical Society, an Honorary Fellowship from Manchester Polytechnic in 1977, and Honorary Doctorates from Nottingham Polytechnic in 1990, Nottingham University in 1994 and De Montfort University in 1998.

This Council added to those honours by granting him the status of Honorary Freeman of the City on 6 June 2008.

The Council stood in tribute to the memories of Honorary Alderman Grace Roberts and Alan Sillitoe, Honorary Freeman.

General Election Results

The following outcomes for the City of Nottingham constituencies in the general election which was held on 6 May 2010, were reported.

the outcomes were as follows:-

Nottingham East:

Christopher Leslie (Labour Co-op) was elected with 15,022 votes – a majority of 6,959 on an improved turnout of 56.4%

Nottingham North:

Graham Allen (Labour) was returned for a further term with 16,646 votes – a majority of 8,138 on an improved turnout of 54.21%

Nottingham South:

Lillian Greenwood (Labour) was elected with 15,209 votes – a majority of 1,772 on an improved turnout of 60.48%"

The Chief Executive congratulated the successful candidates on their election and the City Council looked forward to working with them in the future.

The Chief Executive also thanked colleagues in the Electoral Services Team for their efforts in the organisation and delivery of a high quality election experience at short notice and without major incident.
