### REPORT OF THE PORTFOLIO HOLDER FOR AREA WORKING, CLEANSING AND COMMUNITY SAFETY

### ST ANN'S DESIGNATED PUBLIC PLACE ORDER

### 1 SUMMARY

1.1 This report outlines the procedure through which the Council will consult on making a Designated Public Place Order ("DPPO") that covers the St Ann's ward, (hereinafter referred to as "the Order").

### 2 **RECOMMENDATIONS**

It is recommended that Council:

- 2.1 Note the area proposed to be covered by the Order, detailed on the A4 map circulated separately.
- 2.2 Approve the publication of the draft Order for public consultation, as detailed at Appendix 1.
- 2.2 Note the timetable and procedures for making the Order, as detailed in Appendices 2 and 3 of this report.

### 3 REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATIONS (INCLUDING OUTCOMES OF CONSULTATION)

It is believed that the Order may be required:

- 3.1 To reduce crime and anti-social behaviour, including nuisance and disorder arising from people drinking alcohol in public places in the ward in question.
- 3.2 To improve the quality of life and enjoyment of the area by residents, businesses and visitors.

### 4 <u>OTHER OPTIONS CONSIDERED IN MAKING</u> RECOMMENDATIONS

4.1 Use of current public order powers. These powers do not allow the seizure and disposal of alcohol or the arrest of people who refuse to stop drinking when asked to do so by a police officer.

### 5 BACKGROUND

- 5.1 By virtue of the Criminal Justice and Police Act 2001 the City Council may make a DPPO to curb the problems brought about by irresponsible drinking in public places. The effect of an Order is to make it an offence both to continue drinking when requested to stop and to fail to surrender alcohol when requested to do so. The Act also gives powers to destroy alcohol that has been surrendered. Councillors will be aware that there are a number similar Orders for other parts of the City including Hyson Green, the City Centre and Sneinton and St Ann's.
- 5.2 Evidence to support the making of a DPPO for the area has been gathered which demonstrates the following. Community Protection and the Police in St Ann's have seen an increase in reported problems of people causing nuisance and disorder affecting the enjoyment of the area and the general quality of life of residents, businesses and visitors alike due to the effects of alcohol.
- 5.3 Enforcement will be by Community Protection Officers and the Police as accredited persons for whom training has been given in respect of these powers. The Police have powers of arrest, for both of the offences specified in paragraph 5.1 above. The powers given by the making of the Order are discretionary and it is not intended that they should be used where people are drinking in public places responsibly and without causing nuisance, annoyance, or disturbance.

5.4 The draft Order is attached as Appendix 1 and the timetable for implementation is shown at Appendix 2. A larger copy of the map will be available prior to the meeting together with a copy of the evidence so far provided in support of the Order. The procedures that the Council needs to follow are outlined in Appendix 3. Any representations received during the consultation process will be reported to Council at the expiry of the consultation period in order for Council to formally consider whether the Order should be made

### 6 <u>FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS (INCLUDING VALUE</u> <u>FOR MONEY)</u>

6.1 The total cost, including administration, legal costs, consultation, notices and signage is to be met jointly from the Community Protection budget and from money allocated for this purpose in the relevant Area Committee 2011/12 budget.

# 7 RISK MANAGEMENT ISSUES (INCLUDING LEGAL IMPLICATIONS, CRIME AND DISORDER ACT IMPLICATIONS AND EQUALITY AND DIVERSITY IMPLICATIONS)

7.1 A local authority may designate public places under section 13 of the Act where it is satisfied that nuisance, annovance or disorder associated with the consumption of alcohol in those places has been caused to members of the public or a section of the public. Home Office Guidance indicates that before an Order is made the Council should be satisfied that the problems will continue unless the powers are adopted and that the use of these powers will remedy them. The Council has some evidence within its possession in this respect and continue to collect evidence may durina consultation process. These tests will however have to be addressed should Council determine to make the Order in the future.

### 8. EQUALITY IMPACT ASSESSMENT (EIA)

- 8.1 The results from the consultation will be used to assess any impact on equality which will be reported back to the Council should the results confirm that the Order proceed.

### CRIMINAL JUSTICE AND POLICE ACT 2001, SECTION 13 (2)

### THE NOTTINGHAM CITY COUNCIL ST ANNS DESIGNATED PUBLIC PLACE ORDER 2011

Nottingham City Council in exercise of the powers conferred by section 13(2) of the Criminal Justice and Police Act 2001 ("the Act") hereby makes the following Order:

- The land described in the Schedule below and shown on the plan attached to this Order ("the Plan"), being land in the area of Nottingham City Council which is land to which the Act applies, is hereby designated for the purpose of the Act.
- 2. This Order may be cited as the Nottingham City Council St Anns Designated Public Place Order 2011 and shall come into force on xx xxxxxx 2011.
- 3. "Public Place" means any place to which the public or any section of the public has access on payment or otherwise, as of right or by virtue of express or implied permission.

### SCHEDULE OF DESIGNATED PUBLIC PLACES

All Public Places including all highways, squares, pedestrian areas, public conveniences, doorways, entrances and other open areas within the boundary delineated by a thick black line on the Plan. These include those places described in Parts 1 to 4 to this Schedule but in the event of a conflict between the Plan and the Parts to this Schedule the Plan shall have precedence.

The Council is required to undertake the following actions.

#### Before the Order is made:


- consult on the proposal with the Police, licensees within/on the boundaries of the proposed area and with owners and occupiers of land within the area to be covered by the proposed Order;
- (ii) notify the public by placing notice in the local press and inviting representations as to the proposed Order.

#### After the Order is made:

- (iii) erect permanent signs to inform the public of the effect of the Order;
- (iv) undertake further public notification measures by placing notice in the local press confirming the making of the Order.

It is proposed that any representations received during the consultation procedure be reported to Council at the expiry of the consultation period.
