Street Drinking - Designated Public Palce Order - Consultation

As you may be aware Nottingham City Council has been asked to consider using its powers under the Criminal Justice and Police Act 2001 to make a Designated Public Places Order in the area of Arboretum and Radford and Park shown on the enclosed plan. This is in response to residents concerns regarding irresponsible drinking of alcohol leading to anti-social or nuisance behaviour publicly accessible areas.

By creating such a designated area, if persons are drinking in public spaces and causing anti-social behaviour or a nuisance the police and accredited officers such as Community Support Officers will have the powers to ask the person to stop drinking alcohol and/or take their alcohol from them. If the person refuses to comply with the request, the person could be arrested. This could lead to a Fixed Penalty for the offence or even prosecution of the person and a fine of up to £500.
