

REPORT OF THE DIRECTOR OF DEVELOPMENT & ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES

**APPLICATION FOR A PROVISIONAL ENTERTAINMENTS LICENCE
Revolution, Unit 4 Chapel Quarter, Mount Street, Nottingham**

1 SUMMARY

This application is for a provisional entertainments licence.

2 RECOMMENDATIONS

IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT:

- Committee determine the application having regard to the objection of Nottinghamshire Police and the comments of the Environmental Health Officer, Chief Fire Officer and Building Control Officer; and
- Special Conditions be imposed to the effect that the licence is subject to satisfactory final inspections by the Environmental Health Officer and Chief Fire Officers and to the requirements of the Building Control Officer being met.

3 BACKGROUND

This is part of the Chapel Quarter re-development which will contain Tiger Tiger night club and Fat Cat Café Bar which both have the benefit of a provisional entertainments licence.

4 PROPOSALS

John McDonald has applied for a provisional entertainments licence to provide music only on the ground floor and music and dancing on the first floor as follows:-

Mondays to Saturdays	- 11 am to 1 am
Sundays	- noon to 12.30 am
Sundays preceding bank holidays (excluding Easter)	- noon to 1 am

The Chief Fire Officer has made recommendations regarding the fire precautions. The Environmental Health Officer (food) has reported that the proposals are satisfactory subject to a satisfactory final inspection. The Planning Officer and Pollution Control Officer have no objection. The Building Control Officer is not able to comment at this stage.

If the Committee are minded to grant the application, consideration should be given to the comments of the Officers that will be reported at the meeting. The Police have objected to the application and their letter of objection is attached at Appendix 1.

Ward Councillors have been consulted and have made no comment.

The location of the premises is shown on the attached map, the applicant and Nottinghamshire Police have been invited to attend.

I wish to advise you that it is the intention of the Chief Constable to object to this application on the following grounds:

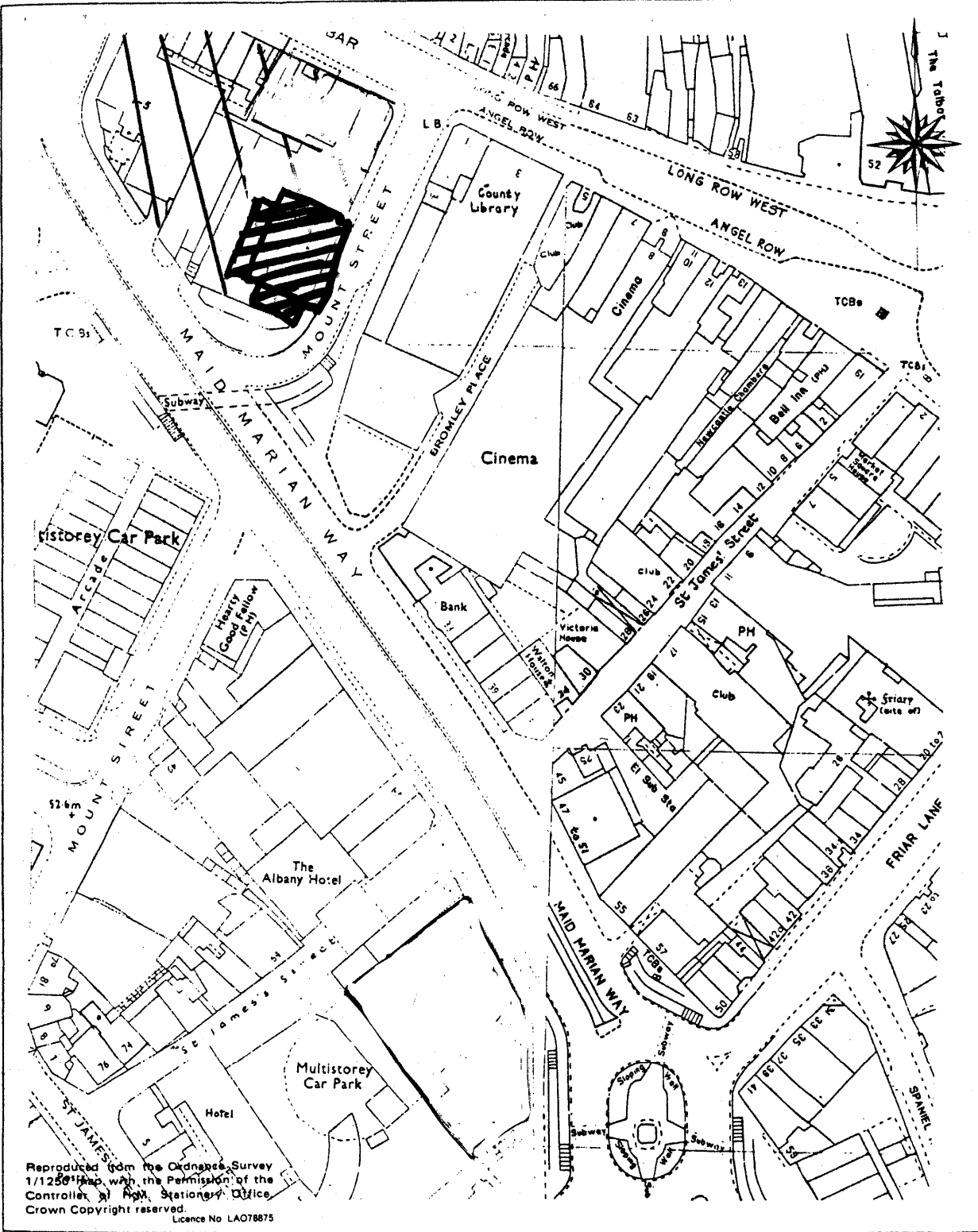
1. The grant of a licence could have an adverse effect on Public Order.
