### REPORT OF CORPORATE DIRECTOR CITY DEVELOPMENT

#### APPLICATION TO RENEW ENTERTAINMENTS LICENCE BAR SEVEN, 6 ILKESTON ROAD, CANNING CIRCUS, NOTTINGHAM

#### 1.0 SUMMARY

1.1 This is an application to renew an entertainments licence to which an objection has been received from a local residents' group.

#### 2.0 RECOMMENDATIONS

- 2.1 IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT the Committee determine the application having regard to an objection from a local residents' group and to the City Council's Entertainments Licensing Policy No 1;
  - 'matters that might present an adverse impact on the neighbourhood from the licensed activity have been assessed and suitable measures put in place to minimise or prevent the impact';
  - 'that the applicants have taken steps to ensure good order inside and outside the premises';
  - 'the applicants can (or have put) in place such effective measures as given above to the satisfaction of the Council and Police'; and
  - to the standard licence conditions of entertainments no 40:- 'Any noise produced or associated with the entertainments must not be audible at the façade of the nearest residential, commercial or industrial premises.'

#### 3.0 BACKGROUND

3.1 A copy of the current entertainments licence is attached and permits music and dancing during the following hours:-

Mondays to Thursdays	-	noon to midnight
Fridays & Saturdays	-	noon to 1 am
Sundays	-	noon to midnight

3.2 The application was made giving the statutory 28 days notice and was accompanied by the required satisfactory electrical test documents.

Dear Sir/Madam,

I am writing as the representative of The Canning Circus Residents against Noise group. We have been informed that you would find it preferable to have a representative to deal with rather than an angry mob, we are angry but are not a mob. We are a collection of neighbours who have been forced to act together because of the excessive noise that we have had to suffer the previous few years. We would like to object to the Public Entertainment License for Bar Seven. Presently it has a license to operate until 1am; this has caused so many problems for the residents of this area. They have already been prosecuted for excessive noise pollution caused this summer. This took an enormous amount of effort from the residents to secure, we had to endure live performances from 2pm until 1am for several months, sometimes they would have up to 5 bands playing in an evening. They also broke the conditions of their license by having live performances in their car park all day on a bank holiday.

The main problems we have are:

1, noise leakage from the premises every performance. They have only just had a noise abatement notice dropped because of a couple of months compliance by them, within 2 weeks the suddenly the noise levels have gone straight back up again and we are again seeking prosecution, but this takes literally months to secure. We have had to wait nearly a whole year to amend this because the problems only started to get a lot worse after their license had been granted in 2003. The situation has changed since this license was first issued because of new residents who have moved in to the property next door and also the massive new residential development opposite. The room that they play live music in is the room next door to the resident's bedroom; the noise levels in the resident's bedroom and living room are unacceptable. Can you imagine having a live band and 100 people dancing and shouting in the room joined on to your bedroom?

2, Noise from the car park is excessive. During the summer, they installed some benches in the car park as a "beer garden" this has lead to residents being verbally abused and harassed on their own property and in their own gardens by drunken yobs. In the summer the drinking carries on throughout the day and all evening until they close so does the noise. In the summer evenings the tables encourage people to hang around after hours sometimes up until 3am. Cars that stay in the car park with their car stereos on loudly and engines running, slamming doors with no consideration for the people living around them. They allow Tour buses to stay in the car park over night after gigs, with generators running and music playing. The bus parks less than 5m away from many older residents bedrooms keeping them awake for hours and making them feel unsafe in their own home. The car park is frequently full and cars spill out and block the resident's of Woodgate courts new entrance, complaints to the council have resulted in a sign asking vehicles not to block the gates and posts being erected, further more destruction has been caused to the wall at the end of the cutthrough to Holden St; which drinkers gather round and sit on. Elderly residents have had to push through crowds of youths drinking to get to their own house.

3, Bar Seven have frequent "lock ins" and continue to play extremely loud music, sometimes until 4am.

4, They have no consideration when throwing out their empty bottles, after they close, usually around 1.30 am we get loud banging and crashing as the bottles smash into the bin. Not only is this disturbing, but generally makes the area unsafe, as smashing glass and crashing has become a feature of nighttime. Many residents' cars have had windows smashed and the contents stolen late at night and nobody has looked out because it was assumed to be the pub. (We realise that this is not directly to do with the Public Entertainment License, but gives a fuller picture of their inconsideration).

We think it was a mistake to turn a pub that is enclosed on four-sides by residential property into a nightclub with live music up to 7 days a week. During the summer they had an average of 4 bands an evening, almost every single night. (I have enclosed a copy of their program for last summer and a couple of days of our observation report. Please note the type of music played i.e. Hardcore Metal, Ska Punk, Heavy Punk rock with weird noises, Grunge rock with a twist of punk etc. all are violent and aggressive types of music, when the people leave they are mostly very drunk and loud.) They attract large groups of young drinkers that are not local to the area, it seems amazing that this is next door a residential complex that has a large number of elderly residents living in warden assisted flats. If you look at the location of the function room you will notice there are only flat brick walls and no trees where the noise escapes this has the effect of amplifying the bass to extreme levels depending on the pitch. There are 16 residents bedrooms within 15m of this room they all receive this noise. Bar Seven has a capacity of 200 persons with 100 persons in the function room; this is the average size of the crowd that leaves in a group as a whole after each "gig". This is in addition to The Running Horse Pub that plays live music 7 days a week that was playing from the other side of the properties completely filling the houses with noise. The Running Horse is restricted to 11.30pm (which we all consider is too late) but Bar Seven that has already been prosecuted is allowed to play until 1am? We must point out that from June to September Bar Seven were aware of the massive problems they were causing but refused to contact the council or talk to the council officers. They continued to make our lives very unpleasant and ruined any chance we had to enjoy the summer. The only reason they reduced the noise was because their summer run of bands "battle of the bands" had finished and they closed over Christmas/New Year. We do not think they deserve the opportunity to do this to us again this summer, they have already proved that they cannot comply

with the regulations. We think their opening hours should be restricted and the public entertainment license revoked or severely restricted considering all the factors involved.
