APPLICATION FOR VARIATION OF ENTERTAINMENTS LICENCE EURO SPORTS BAR, 14 – 16 BATH STREET, SNEINTON, NOTTINGHAM

1.0 **SUMMARY**

1.1 This is an application to vary the hours of the entertainments licence to extend the terminal hour.

2.0 RECOMMENDATIONS

- 2.1 IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT the Committee determine the application having regard to the comments of the Police and to an objection by the Ward Councillor, and;
 - to the City Council's Entertainment Licensing Policy No.1 'Matters that might present an adverse impact on the neighbourhood from the licensed activity have been assessed and suitable measures put in place to minimise or prevent the impact', and;
 - 'Matters that impact on local crime and disorder have been identified and suitable measures to the satisfaction of the Police have been established to minimise or prevent avoidable incidents' and;
 - 'Matters that might present an adverse impact on the neighbourhood from the licensed activity have been assessed and suitable measures put in place to minimise or prevent the impact' and;
 - 'That they have taken steps to ensure good order inside and outside the premises';
 - 'They can (or have put) in place such effective measures as given above to the satisfaction of the Council or Police' and to;
 - the City Council's Entertainments Licensing Policy No 8 'Normally the preferred terminal hour for public entertainment licence will be 11 pm. Any later terminal hour applied for will need to be supported and justified as part of the application'.

3.0 BACKGROUND

3.1 Daniel Cowan holds an entertainments licence to provide music and dancing on the ground floor during the following hours:-

Mondays to Saturdays - 10 am to midnight Sundays - noon to midnight

4.0 PROPOSALS

4.1 Mr Cowan has applied to extend the terminal hour as follows:-

Mondays to Saturdays - 10 am to 2

am

Sundays - noon to

12.30 am

Sundays preceding bank holidays (except Easter) - noon to 2

am

4.2 The Police have objected to the application until 2 am but have agreed to the following hours:-

Mondays to Saturdays - 10 am to 1

am

Sundays - noon to

12.30 am

Sundays preceding bank holidays (except Easter) - noon to 1

am

The applicant has amended his application accordingly to a 1 am terminal hour and the Police have therefore withdrawn their objection and a copy of the Police letter is attached at Appendix 1.

- 4.3 Ward Councillors were consulted and an objection has been received from Councillor Collins. A copy of his email is attached at Appendix 2.
- 4.4 The Planning Officer has no objection but has advised that planning permission was granted last year to convert an existing building to 22 self contained apartments at Tennant Rubber Co Limited in Carlton Road. The location is marked on the attached map.
- 4.5 The Pollution Officer has no objection.
- 4.6 The applicant and Councillor Collins have been invited to attend and the location of the premises is shown on the attached map.
