76 APOLOGY FOR ABSENCE

77 REVENUE BUDGET 2002/03 AND SUPPLEMENTARY LEVY

Consideration was given to a joint report of the Chief Fire Officer and Treasurer, copies of which had been circulated.

It was reported that, due to matters beyond the Authority's control the pension element of the revenue budget would overspend by around £980,000. A number of alternative options had been discussed with both City and County Treasurers and they were in agreement that a supplementary levy is the appropriate response to the overspend.

The levy on the constituent authorities is based on the 2002/03 RSG Tax Base and would result in the following proportions:-

78 LOCAL GOVERNMENT ASSOCIATION (LGA) ANNUAL FIRE CONFERENCE 2003
