To inform Members of the Fire and Rescue 2008 Conference and Exhibition and seek approval for the attendance of Members.

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1. BACKGROUND

Fire 2008 is the biggest fire event of the year and has become the focal point of the fire professionals' annual activities. It is the three days when all concerned with fire prevention and protection come together to exchange ideas, expand their knowledge and discover the latest innovation products and services available.

2. REPORT

- 2.1 The annual Fire and Rescue Conference is to be held in Liverpool at the Arena and Conference Centre from Tuesday 26 August to Thursday 28 August 2008. The conference is once again organised by Fire Conferences and Exhibitions Ltd (FCE) and is timed to coincide with the World Firefighter Games.
- 2.2 The conference programme is still to be finalised, but will cover the latest issues affecting the fire fighting and fire prevention industries. As well as the traditional Chief Fire Officers Association President and Ministerial exchange, the professional development sessions to be discussed at this year's event are such matters as current health and safety issues, operational doctrine, flooding and the environment, comprehensive area assessments and community safety evaluation, as well as several workshops.

3. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

The anticipated cost of attending the conference, including accommodation for two nights, travel and subsistence is yet to be confirmed, but will be approximately £800 per delegate. This can be contained within the budgetary provision for Member Conference Expenses.

4. HUMAN RESOURCES AND LEARNING AND DEVELOPMENT IMPLICATIONS
