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### 1. BACKGROUND

As part of the revised Governance arrangements the Authority has delegated key responsibilities for Community Safety to the Community Safety Committee. As part of those delegated responsibilities the Chair of the Community Safety Committee and the Management lead report to the Authority on its business and actions as agreed at Fire and Rescue Authority meeting 1 June 2007.

### 2. REPORT

- 2.1 The minutes of the meeting of the Community Safety Committee held on Friday 11 July 2008 are attached to this report at Appendix B. The following summarises the main points of the papers discussed at the meeting.
- 2.2 The Committee were firstly in receipt of a report updating Members on home safety check activity and progress of evaluation, following recommendations of the Committee in January 2008. The report outlined:
  - S The results of an evaluation of customer satisfaction, which was published in September 2005 – the most positive outcome of this evaluation was the feedback which suggested individuals were changing their safety habits as a result of the visits.
  - § The process by which homes safety checks are generated.
  - § Targets for home safety checks.
  - A breakdown on home safety checks carried out per district, per financial year (from 2003/04 2007/08) noting that the target set for home safety checks of 25,000 by the end of 2009 has been exceeded and that over 39,000 have been completed so far. It was also noted that as part of the process a total of 51,186 smoke alarms have been fitted up to the end of the financial year 2007/08.
  - S Nottinghamshire's grant allocation to establish a programme of home fire risk checks for the financial years 2004/05 to 2007/08.

It was resolved that the report be noted, and that the full Fire and Rescue Authority be recommended to continue funding the installation of smoke alarms.

2.3 The other report before the Committee detailed the recent changes to the management of Community Safety Advocates within Nottinghamshire Fire and Rescue Service. It was resolved that the report by noted.


