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### 1. BACKGROUND

As part of the revised Governance arrangements the Authority has delegated key responsibilities for Community Safety to the Community Safety Committee. As part of those delegated responsibilities the Chair of the Community Safety Committee and the Management lead report to the Authority on its business and actions as agreed at Fire and Rescue Authority meeting 1 June 2007.

### 2. REPORT

- 2.1 The minutes of the Community Safety Committee held on Friday 3 April 2009 are attached to this report at Appendix A. The following summarises the main points of the papers discussed at the meeting.
- 2.2 Consideration was given to a report updating Members on the Civil Contingencies Act Enhancement Programme (CCAEP) and sought endorsement for maximum contribution to the programme. It was resolved that the report be noted and maximum contribution to CCAEP was agreed.
- 2.3 Members were also in receipt of a report which provided detail of Nottinghamshire Fire and Rescue Service's current First Response Scheme and were also informed of the key findings from the Communities and Local Government (CLG) research report on Co-Responding. It was agreed that the report be noted.
- 2.4. The final report for consideration focused on an update of partnership activity within Nottinghamshire Fire and Rescue Service. Whilst the report was noted and Members encouraged the continued engagement of the Service in the wider partnership and community safety agenda, two further resolutions were made. Firstly, that the Chief Fire Officer submit a report to a future meeting of the Community Safety Committee on how and to what extent the Service was consulted in regard to planning applications and developments. Secondly, that the Chief Fire Officer contact the Chief Executives of the City and County Councils and request that they liaise to ensure that 'weeks of action' for each Authority did not coincide to enable Fire and Rescue Service resources to be dedicated to each event.
