Purpose of Report:

To report to Members on the business and actions of the Community Safety Committee meeting of Friday 17 July 2009.

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1. BACKGROUND

As part of the revised Governance arrangements the Authority has delegated key responsibilities for Community Safety to the Community Safety Committee. As part of those delegated responsibilities the Chair of the Community Safety Committee and the Management lead report to the Authority on its business and actions as agreed at Fire and Rescue Authority meeting 1 June 2007.

2. REPORT

- 2.1 The minutes of the Community Safety Committee held on Friday 17 July 2009 are attached to this report at Appendix A. The following summarises the main points discussed at the meeting.
- 2.2 The Committee had previously requested at their meeting on 17 April 2009 that they would like information regarding the activity being undertaken to address the ongoing high level of unwanted fire signals (automatic fire alarms) responded to by Nottinghamshire Fire and Rescue Service. The focus of the meeting therefore, and the one report presented, was around unwanted fire signals. In addition to the main report considered by the Committee, a report recently considered by the Corporate Management Board was attached as an appendix, which sought to implement a new policy relating to unwanted fire signals, which incorporates a call challenge approach from Fire Control and new methods of managing and reducing this impact on service delivery.
- 2.3 Whilst Members noted the activity being undertaken to improve performance in the area of unwanted fire signals, they also endorsed the implementation of the new policy and process outlined, and the ongoing commitment of the Service to improve its performance in this area.
