




# Phased approach to agreeing targets

- A traffic light system has been used to show targets which are ready to be signed off (**green**), those which need more work but will be agreed by May 2008 (**amber**) and those which are unlikely to be signed off in the 1st stage of LAA (**red**).
- 30<sup>th</sup> May 2008 – Sign off those indicators and their corresponding targets which are ‘green’
- Autumn 08 – Sign off the remaining indicators and targets as soon as they become ‘green’ (when the definitions have been received from CLG)






