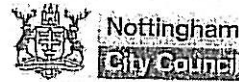
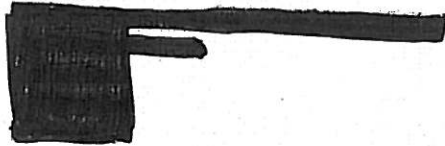

STREET TRADING POSITION – BRIDLESMITH GATE

Unfortunately due to the problems encountered and further representations received I write to give you 14 days notice of the Council's Intention to terminate your trading consent. You are invited to consider one of the pitches available on Clinton St East; other locations, even on an interim basis, have been deemed problematic.

As there has been no breach of the consent conditions, you have a right to appeal against this decision to the Council's Regulatory Committee.

The Council will revoke your consent on 13th August unless you notify the Director of Community and Culture in writing and within seven days of receiving this notice via Neil Ehrhart at the above address, of your wish to appeal to Regulatory Committee.

In response to the letter we received dated 29th July 2008 from the markets and fairs manager, Juice bros. would like to appeal against the Council's decision to cease our trading consent on Bridlesmith Gate.

We have not broken our trading consent agreement, and have had no reasonable explanation in writing as to why we should now be evicted from our pitch after 6 weeks of trading. We spent 14 months of negotiation with the Council prior to trading to ensure that we could be on that pitch including the backing of the Regulatory and Appeals Committee earlier this year to trade on that pitch. We have done everything asked of us by the Council, including compromising our colours and size of our unit at great expense to ourselves to be able to trade on Bridlesmith Gate to blend in with the streets brickwork.

Your decision to end our consent to trade on Bridlesmith Gate will bankrupt us, and we would not only lose our business but our homes. We have the backing and support of the shops and offices on the street for us to be there, which we have in writing with the only negative comment about us, is the fact our generator is still being used and creates noise pollution, as our electricity supply has not been installed as promised by the Council. We would never have started the business if we had known that we would have to use a generator, which is not only a financial drain to ourselves it is also polluting the atmosphere and is a noise pollutant.

We are offering a friendly, quality service at reasonable prices and we are the only healthy option street traders offering 100% pure, fresh, natural drinks with nothing added. The government should be helping small business start ups, especially healthy ones and not putting them out of business. Nottingham has had bad press of late saying how unhealthy the citizens are and has a very high obesity percentage, which is why we thought we would be backed and be able to work alongside the Council educating young and old people on the benefits of living a healthier lifestyle.

We feel discriminated against as we are a small business and bullying tactics are being used to move us off our pitch, as a result of this we have contacted the press and members of Parliament on this matter and our petition will show how much support we are getting from the local workers, shoppers, and business owners/managers. We hope you will see our point of view on this matter and look forward to hearing from you.
