It is a known fact that Melville Street will soon cease to exist due to the forthcoming Broadmarsh extension and in 2005 I was told by the Nottingham Markets and Fairs Service that I would be allowed to trade on Melville Street until the Broadmarsh extension takes place, it is a proven fact that street trading on Melville Street is completely trouble free and it is also a proven fact that street trading in Melville Street provides a high service to the general public that will be missed by many.

Please don't take away street trading in Melville Street as it is my only source of income and has been for me since leaving school, I am skilled in no other way other than being a model street trader in Melville Street and as a direct result of my trading in Melville Street I have a mortgage, children and many other commitments so I please beg you to not take away my livelihood and my ability to pay my own way through life making Melville Street into a prohibited street will do nothing other than place me on the dole and there is absolutely no benefits to anyone or no purpose in prohibiting Melville Street no person or organisation will gain from prohibiting Melville Street instead many people will suffer a loss. Your office will gain nothing by prohibiting Melville Street so I please ask you from the bottom of my heart to please not prohibit Melville Street until the Broadmarsh extension takes place.

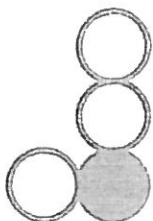
