Dee Fretwell, Finance Analyst, presented Forum with the following information:

- 2013/14 comparison with 2012/13:
 - \circ the 2013/14 grant had increased from £209.794m in 2012/13;
 - the increase of £10.366m was due to:

Early Intervention Grant (EIG) budget transfer – 2 year old and early years funding	<u>£m</u> 4.406
Educational Funding Agency grant inclusion	1.084
Increase in grant to fund pupil growth inflation	4.876

- there was no breach of the Central Expenditure Limit
- all the principles had been included as per the report to Forum on 20 September 2012, and the further updates subsequently presented to Forum.

During discussion, the following comments were made:

- in real terms, the EIG budget transfer only equated to £2.4m and the £4.406m was for 2, 3 and 4 year olds;
- the £4.876m increase in pupil growth and inflation only included approximately £1m to cover inflation, not a substantial amount in today's financial climate;

<u>Action</u>

- the overall DSG grant increase of £10.366m was minimal due to increasing costs;
- while the Forum appreciated that the presenting officer was specifically a financial expert, due to the large sums involved, future reports would need to include a more detailed breakdown, from colleagues with specialised knowledge i.e. Early Years and High Needs, of the reasons for applications for funding and what each category included i.e. 'combined services £2.867m'. Future reports should also include, where possible, figures for the previous 2 / 3 years to allow for comparison and to highlight any trends.

RESOLVED

- (1) that the following be noted:
 - (i) the value of the DSG funding, the pupil premium and the High Needs Block budget allocation;
 - (ii) the principles of the High Needs Block budget allocation and that AWPU would follow an excluded child;
- (2) that it was agreed that the indicative budgets would be distributed in February, prior to the 'per pupil premium' allocation being known;
- (3) that approval of the central expenditure in the Schools Block (totalling £8.589m) and the Early Years Block (totalling £0.999m), and the principal of charging £14,900 per year for an excluded child (prior to development of a new business model), be deferred to the March 2013 meeting to allow for further detail to be included in the report.
