

The Premises trade as an off-licence. At all material times, the Designated Premises supervisor was Ashok Kumar Bharadwaj and the Premises Licence Holders were Ashok Kumar Bharadwaj and Sushma Bharadwaj.

Prevention of Crime and Disorder

The Applicant will allege that the Designated Premises Supervisor and joint Premises Licence Holder has repeatedly sold alcohol to children over a two year period. He has ignored warnings and cautions given in respect of such conduct.

It is the Applicant's case that the Prevention of Crime and Disorder objective has been undermined by the failure to uphold the law relating to underage sales.

Further, the sales of alcohol to those under age has directly or indirectly contributed to crime and disorder, in that, on at least two occasions, children under the influence of alcohol bought from the licence holder have been variously the perpetrators of crime, or the victim of crime.

Public Safety

The Applicant will allege that the sale of alcohol to children has exposed them to a risk to their health and wellbeing, either from the direct effect of consuming alcohol, or by making them more likely to be victims of violent or sexual crime.

The Applicant will allege that a number of complaints have been received in relation to children who have been adversely affected by the consumption of alcohol purchased from the licence holder, both from parents and also from the head of the

Nottingham Girls' High School.

3. Protection of Children from Harm

The Applicant will allege that a number of complaints have been received in relation to children who have been adversely affected by the consumption of alcohol purchased from the licence holder, both from parents and also from the head of the Nottingham Girls' High School.

Further, the Applicant will allege that, while under the influence of alcohol purchased from the licence holder, one child committed an act of Burglary at a local premises.

On one occasion, a child was the victim of a serious sexual attack while affected by alcohol purchased from the licensed premises.

Summary

The applicant seeks a review of the Premises Licence and asks the Licensing Authority to consider revocation as a proportionate response to the matters complained of.

Please provide as much information as possible to support the application (please read guidance note 2)

 On the 25th March 2006, a Test Purchase operation was conducted at the licensed premises. The Designated Premises Supervisor and joint Premises Licence Holder, Ashok Kumar Bharadwaj, sold alcohol to a 15 year old boy.

Ashok Kumar Bharadwaj admitted the matter on the 28th March 2006 and received a formal caution for the offence.

- 2. On the 16th April 2007, the Designated Premises Supervisor and joint Premises Licence Holder, Ashok Kumar Bharadwaj, sold alcohol to a 15 year old girl. The girl went to the Arboretum area of Nottingham to consume the alcohol and whilst there, was the victim of a serious sexual attack.
- 3. On or about the 8th May 2007, the Applicant received information from the Head of the Nottingham Girl's High School concerning the sale of alcohol to schoolgirls at the Licensed Premises. The information received was that one girl had required hospitalisation, another collapsed on the lawn of a friends house and a third was the victim of the sexual attack recounted at paragraph 2 above.
- 4. On the 1st March 2008, a burglary occurred at the Theatre Royal, Nottingham. On the 12th March 2008, four youths were arrested in connection with the offence and admitted being involved. Three of the youths were under the age of 18 and all stated that they had purchased alcohol from the Licensed Premises prior to committing the offence and that they were intoxicated at the time the offence was committed.
- On the 5th March 2008, the Applicant received information from the parent of a 13 year old boy, that the boy had purchased alcohol from the Licensed Premises on the 3rd March 2008 and had returned home in an intoxicated state.
- 6. On the 13th March 2008, the Applicant received information from the parent of a child concerning the sale of alcohol to her son and other children at the Licensed Premises and suggesting that the sales were knowingly made.
- 7. On the 5th April 2008, police officers in plain clothes observed the Licensed Premises and on four separate occasions in a 2 hour period, witnessed children entering the shop and leaving with alcoholic drink they had purchased there. On each occasion, the children were spoken to and their drink confiscated.

On the 11th April 2008, the Designated Premises Supervisor and joint Premises Licence Holder, Ashok Kumar Bharadwaj, was interviewed under caution and admitted not having checked identification before selling alcohol. He also gave an account of having sold some of the drink to an older man who gave it to the children.

On the 18th April 2008, the Designated Premises Supervisor and joint Premises Licence Holder, Ashok Kumar Bharadwaj, spoke to an officer of the Applicant and purported to report the theft of the alcoholic drink sold on the 5th April 2008, claiming it had been stolen by the children without his knowledge.

8. On the 10th May 2008, the Applicant received information from the parent of a 15 year old boy, that the boy had purchased alcohol from the licensed premises and had subsequently required hospitalisation.

On the 16th May 2008, the Designated Premises Supervisor and joint Premises

Dear Licensing officer,

I am writing to you with regards to the application for review of premises license of ASB News, 21b Mansfield Rd, Nottingham. I am a personal licensee at the above named premises and I strongly disagree with the decision to review this license.

I would like to bring to your attention that I was first informed about events that have lead to this review on 6th June 2008 after being handed the application for review by Mr Dave White, Police Licensing Manager at 21b Mansfield Rd whilst I was casually passing by. I was astonished and shocked at being handed this application and at the time did not understand what had been going on until I later on read the application. Despite being a licence holder at the premises I have been sadly kept gravely in the dark about all events, which have occurred since March 2006.

It is greatly unsatisfactory and disappointing that after 2 years and 3 months I was first informed of what had been happening. As a licensee at the premises I should have been made aware of the situation from day one and not once an application of review of the license had been issued.

Further to this on 9th June 2008 Mr Dave White, Police Licensing Manager, handed me a second application for review at Arnold Rd, off license, 75 Arnold Rd, Nottingham, after the first application was no longer legally viable. I would like to stress that this address is not my place of residence and I was again only casually visiting. I find it extremely worrying that in a matter of 3 days I was tracked down and handed two applications for review, when for more than two years I have been not informed in any way about this matter.

With regards to the application of review of the licence on my premises, I have personally spoken to customers with respect to the details that have been provided to support the application for review of license and have found that the customers themselves do not agree with the decision to review the license. Further to this they themselves brought to attention some important

witnessed happenings and offered to kindly conclude these for you in a letter, which they themselves will be sending to you.

The city centre area is commonly known for its constant trouble with youngsters and I strongly feel that it needs to be tackled in an effective way, which should include joint involvement of the council, the police, schools, parents and local businesses. The root of the cause needs to be dealt with instead of leaving the problem unsolved and withdrawing licences from local businesses, which play an important role in the city centre economy.

Mr Bharadwaj has been a part of the Nottingham City centre business community for over 25 years and I personally feel that he is being wrongly blamed, in common terminology, being made an escape goat out of.

I would very much appreciate if you could kindly review this application for review of license and take strongly into consideration what I have said and my customers views and witnessed accounts. It would be greatly disappointing if well established businesses such as this and their customers are affected by the escalating trouble, which has onset itself in Nottingham City Centre.

The above restrictions do not prohibit:

- (a) the taking of the alcohol from the premises, (unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel,) during the first twenty minutes after the above hours;
- (b) the ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises, or the despatch by the vendor of the alcohol so ordered:
- (c) the sale of alcohol to a trader or club for the purposes of the trade or club;
- (d) the sale or supply of alcohol to any canteen or mess, being a canteen in which the sale or supply of alcohol is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of State or an authorised mess of members of Her Majesty's naval, military or air forces.
